The Birth of Jesus the Messiah

This is how Jesus the Messiah was born. His mother, Mary, was engaged to be married to Joseph. But before the marriage took place, while she was still a virgin, she became pregnant through the power of the Holy Spirit. 19 Joseph, her fiancé, was a good man and did not want to disgrace her publicly, so he decided to break the engagement quietly.

²⁰As he considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream. "Joseph, son of David," the angel said, "do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife. For the child within her was conceived by the Holy Spirit. ²¹And she will have a son, and you are to name him Jesus," for he will save his people from their sins."

Lord's message through his prophet: 23 "Look! The virgin will conceive a

23 "Look! The virgin will conceive child!

She will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel,* which means 'God is with us'" ²⁴When Joseph woke up, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded and took Mary as his wife. ²⁵But he did not have sexual relations with her until her son was born. And Joseph named him Jesus.

Visitors from the East

2 Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the reign of King Herod. About that time some wise men* from eastern lands arrived in Jerusalem, asking, 2**Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star as it rose,* and we have come to worship him.*

³King Herod was deeply disturbed when he heard this, as was everyone in Jerusalem. ⁴He called a meeting of the leading priests and teachers of religious law and asked, "Where is the Messiah supposed to be born?"

5"In Bethlehem in Judea," they said, "for this is what the prophet wrote:

6 'And you, O Bethlehem in the land of Judah, are not least among the ruling cities' of Judah, for a ruler will come from you who will be the shepherd for my people Israel.**"

Then Herod called for a private meeting with the wise men, and he learned from them the time when the star first appeared. *Then he told them, "Go to Bethlehem and search carefully for the child. And when you find him, come back and tell me with at I can go and worship him, too!"

"After this interview the wise men went their way. And the star they had seen in the east guided them to Bethlehem. Then they opened their treasure chests and gave him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

The Escape to Egypt

¹³After the wise men were gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. "Get up! Flee to Egypt with the child and his mother," the angel said. "Stay there until I tell you to return, because Herod is going to search for the child to kill him."

14That night Joseph left for Egypt with the child and Mary, his mother, 15 and they stayed there until Herod's death. This fulfilled what the Lord had spoken through the prophet: "I called my Son out of Egypt."*

¹⁶Herod was furious when he realized that the wise men had outwitted him. He sent soldiers to kill all the boys in and around Bethlehem who were two years old and under, based on the wise men's report of the star's first appearance. ¹⁷Herod's brutal action fulfilled what God had spoken through the prophet Jeremiah:

18 "A cry was heard in Ramah weeping and great mourning. Rachel weeps for her children, refusing to be comforted,

for they are dead."* The Return to Nazareth

¹⁹When Herod died, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt. ²⁰"Get up!" the angel said. "Take the child and his mother back to the land of Israel, because those who were trying to kill the child are dead."

²¹So Joseph got up and returned to the land of Israel with Jesus and his mother. ²²But when he learned that the new ruler of Judea was Herds ods son Archelaus, he was afraid to go there. Then, after being warned in a dream, he left for the region of Gailiee. ²²So the family went and lived in a town called Nazareth. This fulfilled what the prophets had said: "He will be called a Nazarene."

John the Baptist Prepares the Way

3 In those days John the Baptist came to the Judean wilderness and began preaching. His message was, ²"Repent of your sins and turn to God, for the Kingdom of Heaven is near.*" ³The prophet Isaiah was speaking about John when he said,

"He is a voice shouting in the wilderness.

'Prepare the way for the LORD's coming!

Clear the road for him!"*

People from Jerusalem and from all of Judea and all over the Jordan Valley went out to see and hear John. And when they confessed their sins, he baptized them in the Jordan River

⁷But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming to watch him baptize,* he denounced them. "You brood of snakes!" he exclaimed. "Who warned you to flee God's coming wrath? 8Prove by the way you live that you have repented of your sins and turned to God. Don't just say to each other, 'We're safe, for we are descendants of Abraham.' That means nothing, for Ltell you. God can create children of Abraham from these very stones. 10 Even now the ax of God's judgment is poised, ready to sever the roots of the trees. Yes, every tree that does not produce good fruit will be chopped down and thrown into the fire

11"I baptize with* water those who repent of their sins and turn to God. But someone is coming soon who is greater than I am—so much greater that I'm not worthy even to be his slave and carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire.* 1"He is ready to separate the chaff from the wheat with his winnowing fork. Then he will clean up the threshing area, gathering the wheat into his barn but burning the chaff with neverending fire."

The Baptism of Jesus

¹³Then Jesus went from Galilee to the Jordan River to be baptized by John. ¹⁴But John tried to talk him out of it. "I am the one who needs to be baptized by you," he said, "so why are you coming to me?"

¹⁵But Jesus said, "It should be done, for we must carry out all that God requires.*" So John agreed to haptize him.

¹⁶After his baptism, as Jesus came up out of the water, the heavens were opened* and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and settling on him. ¹⁷And a voice from heaven said, "This is my dearly loved Son, who brings me great jow."

The Temptation of Jesus

4 Then Jesus was led by the Spirtit into the wilderness to be tempted there by the devil. ²For forty days and forty nights he fasted and became very hungry.

³During that time the devil* came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become loaves of bread."

⁴But Jesus told him, "No! The Scriptures say,

'People do not live by bread alone.

but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.'*"

⁵Then the devil took him to the holy city, Jerusalem, to the highest point of the Temple, ⁶and said, "If you are the Son of God, jump off! For the Scriptures say,

10"Get out of here, Satan," Jesus told him. "For the Scriptures say,

'You must worship the Lord your God and serve only him.'*"

11Then the devil went away, and angels came and took care of Iesus.

The Ministry of Jesus Begins

¹²When Jesus heard that John had
been arrested, he left Judea and
returned to Galilee. ¹³He went first to
Nazareth, then left there and moved
to Capernaum, beside the Sea of Galilee. in the region of Zebulun and

Naphtali. 14This fulfilled what God

said through the prophet Isaiah:

15 "In the land of Zebulun and
of Naphtali,

beside the sea, beyond the Jordan River,

in Galilee where so many Gentiles live,

16 the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light. And for those who lived in the land where death casts its shadow,

a light has shined."*

¹⁷From then on Jesus began to preach, "Repent of your sins and turn to God, for the Kingdom of Heaven is near.*"

The First Disciples

18 One day as Jesus was walking along the shore of the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers—Simon, also called Peter, and Andrew—throwing a net into the water, for they fished for a living, "Jesus called out to them, "Come, follow me, and I will show you how to fish for people!" and they left their nets at once and followed him.

"Al little farther up the shore he saw two other brothers, James and John, sitting in a boat with their father, Zebedee, repairing their nets. And he called them to come, too. "They immediately followed him, leaving the boat and their father behind.

Crowds Follow Jesus

²²Jesus traveled throughout the region of Galliee, teaching in the synogogues and announcing the Good News about the Kingdom. And he healed every kind of disease and illness. "News about him spread as far as Syria, and people soon began bringing to him all who were sick. And whatever their sickness or disease, or if they were demonpossessed or epileptic or paralyzed—he healed them all. "Large

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crowds followed him wherever he went—people from Galilee, the Ten Towns,* Jerusalem, from all over Judea, and from east of the Jordan River.

The Sermon on the Mount

5 One day as he saw the crowds gathering, Jesus went up on the mountainside and sat down. His disciples gathered around him, ² and he began to teach them.

For a great reward awaits you in heaven. And remember, the ancient prophets were persecuted in the same way.

Teaching about Salt and Light

13"You are the salt of the earth. But what good is salt if it has lost its flavor? Can you make it salty again? It will be thrown out and trampled underfoot as worthless.

14"You are the light of the world—like a city on a hillitop that cannot be hidden. ¹⁸No one lights a lamp and then puts it under a basket. Instead, a lamp is placed on a stand, where it gives light to everyone in the house. ¹⁶In the same way, let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father.

Teaching about the Law

^{79*}Don't misunderstand why I have come. I did not come to abolish the law of Moses or the writings of the prophets. No, I came to accomplish their purpose. ¹⁸ I tell you the truth, until heaven and earth disappear, not even the smallest detail of God's law will disappear until Its purpose is achieved. ¹⁹So if you ignore the least commandment and teach others to do the same, you will be called the least in the Kingdom of Heaven. But anyone who obeys God's laws and teaches them will be called great in the Kingdom of Heaven.

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20"But I warn you—unless your righteousness is better than the righteousness of the teachers of religious law and the Pharisees, you will never enter the Kingdom of Heaven!

Teaching about Anger

^{21*}You have heard that our ancestors were told, 'You must not murder. If you commit murder, you are subject to judgment.'* "Pbut I say, if you are even angry with someone," you are subject to judgment! If you call someone an idiot,* you are in danger of being brought before the court. And if you curse someone,* you are in danger of the fires of hell.*

²⁰ 'So if you are presenting a sacrifice at the altar in the Temple and you suddenly remember that someone has something against you, 2*leave your sacrifice there at the altar. Go and be reconciled to that person. Then come and offer your sacrifice to God.

25"When you are on the way to court with your adversary, settle your differences quickly. Otherwise, your accuser may hand you over to the judge, who will hand you over to an officer, and you will be thrown into prison. *And if that happens, you surely won't be free again until you have paid the last penny.*

Teaching about Adultery

27"You have heard the commandment that says, 'You must not commit adultery.'* 28But I say, anyone who even looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart. 2050 if your eye even your good eye*—causes you to lust, gouge it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to be thrown into hell. 204A dif your hand—even your stronger hand* causes you to sin, cut it off and through it away. It is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to be thrown into hell.

Teaching about Divorce

31"You have heard the law that says, A man can divorce his wife by merely giving her a written notice of divorce.** 2*Paut I say that a man who divorces his wife, unless she has been unfaithful, causes her to commit adultery. And anyone who marries a divorced woman also commits adultery.

Teaching about Vows

3b*You have also heard that our ancestors were told, 'You must not break your vows; you must carry out the vows you make to the Lord.'* a 'But Isay do not make any vows! Do not say, 'By heaven!' because heaven is God's throne. 3bAnd do not say, 'By the earth!' because the earth is his footstool. And do not say, 'By Jerusalem!' for Jerusalem is the city of the great King. 3cD not even say, 'By my head!' for you can't turn one hair white or black. 37Just say a simple, 'Yes, I will,' or 'No, I won't.' Anything bevond this is from the evil one.

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Teachina about Revenae

38-You have heard the law that says the punishment must match the injury. An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth.** "Pbut I say, do not resist an evil person! If someone slaps you on the right cheek, offer the other cheek also. "If you are sued in court and your shirt is taken from you, give your coat, too. "If a soldier demands that you carry his gear for a mile," carry it two miles. "Give to those who ask, and don't turn away from those who want to borrow.

Teaching about Love for Enemies 43"You have heard the law that says. 'Love your neighbor'* and hate your enemy. 44But I say, love your enemies!* Pray for those who persecute vou! 45 In that way, you will be acting as true children of your Father in heaven. For he gives his sunlight to both the evil and the good, and he sends rain on the just and the uniust alike. 46If vou love only those who love you, what reward is there for that? Even corrupt tax collectors do that much, 47 If you are kind only to your friends,* how are you different from anyone else? Even pagans do that, 48But you are to be perfect, even as your Father in heaven is perfect.

Teaching about Giving to the Needy

"Watch out! Don't do your good

deeds publicly, to be admired by others, for you will lose the reward from your Father in heaven. When you give to someone in need, don't do as the hypocrites do—blowing trumpets in the synagogues and streets to call attention to their acts of charity! I tell you the truth, they have received all the reward they will ever get. *But when you give to someone in need, don't let your left hand know what your girt sin private, and your Father, who sees everything, will reward you.

Teaching about Prayer and Fasting

5"When you pray, don't be like the hypocrites who love to pray publicly on street corners and in the synagogues where everyone can see them. I tell you the truth, that is all the reward they will ever get. "But when you pray, go away by yourself, shut the door behind you, and pray to your Father in private. Then your Father, who sees everything, will reward you.

""When you pray, don't babble on and on as people of other religions do. They think their prayers are answered merely by repeating their words again and again. "Don't be like them, for your Father knows exactly what you need even before you ask him!" Pray like this:

Our Father in heaven, may your name be kept holv.

May your Kingdom come soon. May your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.

14"If you forgive those who sin against you, your heavenly Father will forgive you. 15But if you refuse to forgive others, your Father will not forgive your sins.

16°And when you fast, don't make it obvious, as the hypocrites do, for they try to look miserable and disheveled so people will admire them for their fasting. I tell you the truth, that is the only reward they will ever get. ¹⁷But when you fast, comb your hair and wash your face. ¹⁸Then no one will notice that you are fasting, except your Father, who knows what you do in private. And your Father, who sees everything, will reward you.

Teaching about Money and Possessions

19**Don't store up treasures here on earth, where moths eat them and rust destroys them, and where thieves break in and steal. 4*Store your treasures in heaven, where moths and rust cannot destroy, and thieves do not break in and steal. 4*Wherever your treasure is, there the desires of your heart will also be.

22"Your eye is a lamp that provides light for your body. When your eye is good, your whole body is filled with light. ²³But when your eye is bad, your whole body is filled with darkness. And if the light you think you have is actually darkness, how deep that darkness is!

24"No one can serve two masters. For you will hate one and love the other; you will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money.

25"That is why I tell you not to worry about everyday life-whether you have enough food and drink, or enough clothes to wear. Isn't life more than food, and your body more than clothing? **Iook at the birds. They don't plant or harvest or store food in barns, for your heavenly Faher feeds them. And aren't you far more valuable to him than they are? **Can all your worries add a single moment to your life?

28"And why worry about your clothing? Look at the lilies of the field and how they grow. They don't work or make their clothing. "Syet Solomon in all his glory was not dressed as beautifully as they are. "And if God cares so wonderfully for wildflowers that are here today and thrown into the fire tomorrow, he will certainly care for you. Why do you have so little faith?

³¹"So don't worry about these things, saying, What will we eat? What will we drink? What will we wear? ³²These things dominate the thoughts of unbelievers, but your heavenly Father already knows all your needs. ³³Seek the Kingdom of

God* above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need.

³⁴ So don't worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring its own worries. Today's trouble is enough for today.

Do Not Judge Others

7 "Do not judge others, and you will not be judged. 'For you will be treated as you treat others.* The standard you use in judging is the standard by which you will be judged.*

"And why worry about a speck in your friend's eye when you have a log in your own? "How can you think of saying to your friend.* "Let me help you get rid of that speck in your eye," when you can't see past the log in your own eye? *Hypocrite! First get rid of the log in your own eye; then you will see well enough to deal with the speck in your friend's eye.

"Don't waste what is holy on people who are unholy.* Don't throw your pearls to pigs! They will trample the pearls, then turn and attack you.

Effective Prayer

2"Keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and the door will be opened to you. *For everyone who asks, receives. Everyone who seeks, finds. And to everyone who knocks, the door will be opened.

9"You parents—if your children ask for a loaf of bread, do you give them a stone instead? "Or if they ask for a fish, do you give them a snake? Of course not!" 'So if you sire them a snake? Or course not! "Is oil you sire them a snake? on course not!" of your good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give good gifts to those who ask him.

The Golden Rule

12"Do to others whatever you would like them to do to you. This is the essence of all that is taught in the law and the prophets.

The Narrow Gate

13"You can enter God's Kingdom only through the narrow gate. The highway to hell* is broad, and its gate is wide for the many who choose that way. "But the gateway to life is very narrow and the road is difficult, and only a few ever find it.

The Tree and Its Fruit

19"Beware of false prophets who come disguised as harmless sheep but are really vicious wolves. "You can identify them by their fruit, that is, by the way they act. Can you pick grapes from thornbushes, or figs from thistles?" Ag good tree produces good fruit, and a bad tree produces bad fruit. "Ag good tree can't produce bad fruit, and a bad tree can't produce good fruit. "So every tree that does not produce good fruit is chopped down and thrown into the fire. "O'Ves, just as you can
