Thank you for speaking to me through Scripture.


Help me to follow where you lead so that I become more and

more like Christ and reflect you powerfully in the world around me.



A second-edition text was published in 2004, with minor changes subsequently introduced in 2007, 2013, and 2015. This Catholic Edition, first published in 2015, includes the full biblical canon recognized by the Roman Catholic Church.

The goal of any Bible translation is to convey the meaning and content of the ancient Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek texts as accurately as possible to contemporary readers. The challenge for our translators was to create a text that would communicate as clearly and powerfully to today's readers as the original texts did to readers and listeners in the ancient biblical world. The resulting translation is easy to read and understand, while also accurately communicating the meaning and content of the original biblical texts. The NLT is a general-purpose text especially good for personal study, devotional reading, and reading aloud in groups. The text of the NLT was reviewed by a group of eminent Catholic scholars, and the Imprimatur was granted by Oswald Cardinal Gracias, Archbishop of Bombay, on April 29, 2015.

We believe that the New Living Translation—which combines the latest biblical scholarship with a clear, dynamic writing style—will communicate God's word powerfully to all who read it. We publish it with the prayer that God will use it to speak his timeless truth to the Church and the world in a fresh, new way.

We are happy to present the Catholic Edition of the New Living Translation of the Bible, made from the original Hebrew and Greek. Published originally in the United States of America, it has met with great success both in America and in other parts of the world. Following the principle of dynamic equivalence, it provides a refreshingly fluid reading of the Scriptures, which may be missing in more literal translations. It presents the biblical message in a language accessible even to non-Christians, as suggested by the Dogmatic Constitution Dei Verbum (on Divine Revelation), 25. However, as such, it is not meant for liturgical use, which, according to Liturgiam Authenticam, calls for a more literalistic approach.

To meet the requirements of Catholic orthodoxy and in agreement with Tyndale House Publishers, who were the original publishers, this translation has been scrutinized by a team of duly qualified Catholic biblical scholars.

The Catholic Edition of the New Living Translation will be a great help for personal reading, study, and prayer. With its flowing text and useful marginal references, it will also provide a useful tool for Lectio Divina sharing and other prayer groups. As Vatican II put it, in the conclusion of the Dogmatic Constitution Dei Verbum (on Divine Revelation),

Through the reading and study of the sacred books, 'the word of God may spread rapidly and be glorified' (2 Thessalonians 3:1), and the treasure of revelation, entrusted to the Church, may more and more fill the hearts of people. Just as the life of the Church is strengthened through more frequent celebration of the Eucharistic mystery, similarly we may hope for a new stimulus for the life of the Spirit from growing reverence for the word of God which 'lasts forever' (Isaiah 40:8; see 1 Peter 1:23-25). (Dei Verbum, 26)

We are grateful to the Catholic biblical scholars such as Rev. Dr. Lucien Legrand, MEP, Rev. Dr. Assisi Saldanha, CSsR, and Rev. Dr. Govindu Rayanna who formed the core team, along with several other biblical experts, for their dedicated and hard work over two years to prepare the Catholic Edition of the New Living Translation. We congratulate Mr. Nigel Fernandes of the Asian Trading Corporation for obtaining the rights to publish a Catholic Edition of the New Living Translation in India. 

The Story of Noah

9This is the account of Noah and his family. Noah was a righteous man, the only blameless person living on earth at the time, and he walked in close fellowship with God. 10 Noah was the father of three sons: Shem, Ham, and Iabheth.

¹¹Now God saw that the earth had become corrupt and was filled with violence. ¹²God observed all this corruption in the world, for everyone on earth was corrupt. ¹³So God said to Noah, "I have decided to destroy all living creatures, for they have filled the earth with violence. Yes, I will wipe them all out along with the earth!

14"Build a large boat* from cypress wood* and waterproof it with tar, inside and out. Then construct decks and stalls throughout its interior. 15 Make the boat 450 feet long, 75 feet wide, and 45 feet high.* 16 Leave an 18-inch opening* below the roof all the way around the boat. Put the door on the side, and build three decks inside the boat—lower, middle, and upper.

17"Look! I am about to cover the earth with a flood that will destroy every living thing that breathes. Everything on earth will die. 18But I will confirm my covenant with you. So enter the boat—you and your wife and your sons and their wives. 19Bring a pair of every kind of animal—a male and a female—into the boat with you to keep them alive during the flood. 20Pairs of every kind of bird, and every kind of animal, and every kind of small animal that scurries along the ground, will come to you to be kept alive. 21And be sure to take on board enough food for your family and for all the animals."

22So Noah did everything exactly as God had commanded him.

The Flood Covers the Earth

When everything was ready, the LORD said to Noah, "Go into the boat with all your family, for among all the people of the earth, I can see that you alone are righteous. 2 Take with you seven pairs—male and female—of each animal I have approved for eating and for sacrifice,* and take one pair of each of the others. 3 Also take seven pairs of every kind of bird. There must be a male and a female in each pair to ensure that all life will survive on the earth after the flood. 4 Seven days from now I will make the rains pour down on the earth. And it will rain for forty days and forty nights, until I have wiped from the earth all the living things I have created."

5So Noah did everything as the LORD commanded him.

6Noah was 600 years old when the flood covered the earth. 7He went on board the boat to escape the flood—he and his wife and his sons and their wives. 8With them were all the various kinds of animals—those approved for eating and for sacrifice and those that were not—along with all the birds and the small animals that scurry along the ground. 9They entered the boat in pairs, male and female, just as God had commanded Noah. 10After seven days, the waters of the flood came and covered the earth.

¹¹When Noah was 600 years old, on the seventeenth day of the second month, all the underground waters erupted from the earth, and the rain fell in mighty torrents from the sky. ¹²The rain continued to fall for forty days and forty nights.
