

Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in his ways. He guides the humble in what is right and teaches them his way.

PSALM 25:8-9, NIV

Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good! His faithful love endures forever. Has the LORD redeemed you? Then speak out! Tell others he has redeemed you from your enemies.

PSALM 107:1-2

Dealing with pride

We see it in others—the turned-up noses, the snooty attitudes, the highfalutin language. Is there someone in your life these days who is like that? Are you thinking, Who gave them the right to look down on me? The Bible says they "wear pride like a jeweled necklace and clothe themselves with cruelty" (Psalm 73:6). That sounds exactly like a person who just got their second pair of britches. But there's another side to this coin: you. Is there someone in your life you look down on? Jesus said, "Why worry about a speck in your friend's eye when you have a log in your own?" (Matthew 7:3). Ask God to show you your own pairs of britches. Ask him to give you a heart filled with humility in your own life.
