

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## EPISTLE DEDICATORY FOR THE AUTHORISED KING JAMES VERSION

To the Most High and Mighty Prince

JAMES

By the Grace of God King of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, &c. The Translators of the Bible wish Grace, Mercy, and Peace through Jesus Christ our Lord

GREAT AND MANIFOLD were the blessings, most dread Sovereign, which Almighty God, the Father of all mercies, bestowed upon us the people of *England*, when first he sent Your Majesty's Royal Person to rule and reign over us. For whereas it was the expectation of many, who wished not well unto our *Sion*, that upon the setting of that bright *Occidental Star*, Queen *Elizabeth* of most happy memory, some thick and palpable clouds of darkness would so have overshadowed this Land, that men should have been in doubt which way they were to walk; and that it should hardly be known, who was to direct the unsettled State; the appearance of Your Majesty, as of the *Sun* in his strength, instantly dispelled those supposed and surmised mists, and gave unto all that were well affected exceeding cause of comfort; especially when we beheld the Government established in Your Highness, and Your hopeful Seed, by an undoubted Title, and this also accompanied with peace and tranquility at home and abroad.

But among all our joys, there was no one that more filled our hearts, than the blessed continuance of the preaching of God's sacred Word among us; which is that inestimable treasure, which excelleth all the riches of the earth; because the fruit thereof extendeth itself, not only to the time spent in this transitory world, but directeth and disposeth men unto that eternal happiness which is above in heaven.

Then not to suffer this to fall to the ground, but rather to take it up, and to continue it in that state, wherein the famous Predecessor of Your Highness did leave it: nay, to go forward with the confidence and resolution of a Man in maintaining the truth of Christ, and propagating it far and near, is that which hath so bound and firmly knit the hearts of all Your Majesty's loyal and religious people unto You, that Your very name is precious among them: their eye doth behold You with comfort, and they bless You in their hearts, as that sanctified Person who, under God, is the immediate Author of their true happiness. And this their contentment doth not diminish or decay, but every day increaseth and taketh strength, when they observe, that the zeal of Your Majesty toward the house of God doth not slack or go backward, but is more and more kindled, manifesting itself abroad in the farthest parts of *Christendom*, by writing in defence of the Truth, (which hath given such a blow unto that man of sin, as will not be healed,) and every day at home, by religious and learned discourse, by frequenting the house of God, by hearing the

Word preached, by cherishing the Teachers thereof, by caring for the Church, as a most tender and loving nursing Father.

There are infinite arguments of this right Christian and religious affection in Your Majesty; but none is more forcible to declare it to others than the vehement and perpetuated desire of accomplishing and publishing of this work, which now with all humility we present unto Your Majesty. For when Your Highness had once out of deep judgment apprehended how convenient it was, that out of the Original Sacred Tongues, together with comparing of the labours, both in our own, and other foreign Languages, of many worthy men who went before us, there should be one more exact Translation of the holy Scriptures into the English Tongue; Your Majesty did never desist to urge and to excite those to whom it was commended, that the work might be hastened, and that the business might be expedited in so decent a manner, as a matter of such importance might justly require.

And now at last, by the mercy of God, and the continuance of our labours, it being brought unto such a conclusion, as that we have great hopes that the Church of *England* shall reap good fruit thereby; we hold it our duty to offer it to Your Majesty, not only as to our King and Sovereign, but as to the principal Mover and Author of the work: humbly craving of Your most Sacred Majesty, that since things of this quality have ever been subject to the censures of ill-meaning and discontented persons, it may receive approbation and patronage from so learned and judicious a Prince as Your Highness is, whose allowance and acceptance of our labours shall more honour and encourage us, than all the calumniations and hard interpretations of other men shall dismay us. So that if, on the one side, we shall be traduced by Popish Persons at home or abroad, who therefore will malign us, because we are poor instruments to make God's holy Truth to be yet more and more known unto the people, whom they desire still to keep in ignorance and darkness; or if, on the other side, we shall be maligned by self-conceited Brethren, who run their own ways, and give liking unto nothing, but what is framed by themselves, and hammered on their anvil; we may rest secure, supported within by the truth and innocency of a good conscience, having walked the ways of simplicity and integrity, as before the Lord; and sustained without by the powerful protection of Your Majesty's grace and favour, which will ever give countenance to honest and Christian endeavours against bitter censures and uncharitable imputations.

The Lord of heaven and earth bless Your Majesty with many and happy days, that, as his heavenly hand hath enriched Your Highness with many singular and extraordinary graces, so You may be the wonder of the world in this latter age for happiness and true felicity, to the honour of that great God, and the good of his Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord and only Saviour.

<sup>28</sup>And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.

<sup>29</sup>And God said, Behold, I have given you every herb bearing seed, which is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree, in the which is the fruit of a tree yielding seed; to you it shall be for meat.\*

30 And to every beast of the earth, and to every fowl of the air, and to every thing that creepeth upon the earth, wherein there is life, I have given every green herb for meat: and it was so.

<sup>31</sup>And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. And the evening and the morning were the sixth day.

<sup>2</sup>And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made.

<sup>3</sup>And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he had rested from all his work which God created and made.

#### The Man and Woman in Eden

<sup>4</sup>These are the generations of the heavens and of the earth when they were created, in the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens,

5 and every plant of the field before it was in the earth, and every herb of the field before it grew: for the LORD God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was not a man to till the ground.

<sup>6</sup>But there went up a mist from the earth, and watered the whole face of the ground.

<sup>7</sup>And the LORD God formed man *of* the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.

8And the LORD God planted a garden eastward in Eden; and there he put the man whom may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden:

he had formed.

9And out of the ground made the LORD God to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of knowledge shall not surely die: of good and evil.

<sup>10</sup>And a river went out of Eden to water the garden; and from thence it was parted, and be-

came into four heads.

<sup>11</sup>The name of the first *is* Pison: that *is* it which compasseth the whole land of Havilah, where there is gold;

<sup>12</sup>and the gold of that land is good: there is

bdellium and the onvx stone.

<sup>13</sup>And the name of the second river is Gihon: the same is it that compasseth the whole land of Ethiopia.

<sup>14</sup>And the name of the third river is Hiddekel: that is it which goeth toward the east of Assyria. And the fourth river is Euphrates.

<sup>15</sup>And the Lord God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to

<sup>21</sup>And the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept: and he took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof;

<sup>22</sup>and the rib, which the LORD God had taken from man, made he a woman, and brought her unto the man.

<sup>23</sup>And Adam said. This *is* now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man.

24Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh.'

<sup>25</sup>And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed.

Now the serpent was more subtil than any **)** beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said unto the woman. Yea, hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden?\*

<sup>2</sup>And the woman said unto the serpent, We

> <sup>14</sup>And the Lord God said unto the serpent. Because thou hast done this, thou art cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life:

> 15 and I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed: it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.\*

> <sup>16</sup>Unto the woman he said, I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; in

sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire *shall be* to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee.

<sup>17</sup>And unto Adam he said, Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed *is* the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat *of* it all the days of thy life;

<sup>18</sup>thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field;

<sup>19</sup>in the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou *art*, and unto dust shalt thou return.

<sup>20</sup>And Adam called his wife's name Eve; because she was the mother of all living.

<sup>21</sup>Unto Adam also and to his wife did the LORD God make coats of skins, and clothed them.

<sup>22</sup>And the LORD God said, Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil: and now, lest he put forth his hand, and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever:

<sup>23</sup>therefore the LORD God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken.

5but unto Cain and to his offering he had not respect. And Cain was very wroth, and his countenance fell.\*

<sup>6</sup>And the LORD said unto Cain, Why art thou wroth? and why is thy countenance fallen?

'If thou doest well, shalt thou not be accepted? and if thou doest not well, sin lieth at the door. And unto thee *shall be* his desire, and thou shalt rule over him.

<sup>8</sup>And Cain talked with Abel his brother: and it came to pass, when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother, and slew him

<sup>9</sup>And the LORD said unto Cain, Where *is* Abel thy brother? And he said, I know not: *Am* I my brother's keeper?

<sup>10</sup>And he said, What hast thou done? the voice of thy brother's blood crieth unto me from the ground.

<sup>11</sup>And now *art* thou cursed from the earth, which hath opened her mouth to receive thy brother's blood from thy hand.

<sup>12</sup>When thou tillest the ground, it shall not henceforth yield unto thee her strength; a fugitive and a vagabond shalt thou be in the earth.

<sup>13</sup>And Cain said unto the LORD, My punishment *is* greater than I can bear.

14Behold, thou hast driven me out this day from the face of the earth; and from thy face shall I be hid; and I shall be a fugitive and a vagabond in the earth; and it shall come to pass, that every one that findeth me shall slay me.

<sup>15</sup>And the LORD said unto him, Therefore whosoever slayeth Cain, vengeance shall be taken on him sevenfold. And the LORD set a mark upon Cain, lest any finding him should kill him.

<sup>16</sup>And Cain went out from the presence of the LORD, and dwelt in the land of Nod, on the east of Eden.

#### The Descendants of Cain

<sup>17</sup>And Cain knew his wife; and she conceived, and bare Enoch: and he builded a city, and called the name of the city, after the name of his son, Enoch.

<sup>18</sup>And unto Enoch was born Irad: and Irad begat Mehujael: and Mehujael begat Methusael: and Methusael begat Lamech.

<sup>19</sup>And Lamech took unto him two wives: the name of the one *was* Adah, and the name of the other Zillah

<sup>20</sup> And Adah bare Jabal: he was the father of such as dwell in tents, and of such as have cattle.

<sup>21</sup>And his brother's name *was* Jubal: he was the father of all such as handle the harp and organ.\*

<sup>22</sup>And Zillah, she also bare Tubal-cain, an instructor of every artificer in brass and iron: and the sister of Tubal-cain *was* Naamah.\*

<sup>23</sup>And Lamech said unto his wives, Adah and Zillah, Hear my voice; ye wives of Lamech, hearken unto my speech: for I have slain a man to my wounding, and a young man to my hurt.

<sup>24</sup>If Cain shall be avenged sevenfold, truly Lamech seventy and sevenfold.

#### The Birth of Seth

<sup>25</sup>And Adam knew his wife again; and she bare a son, and called his name Seth: For God, *said she*, hath appointed me another seed instead of Abel, whom Cain slew.

<sup>26</sup>And to Seth, to him also there was born a son; and he called his name Enos: then began men to call upon the name of the LORD.

#### The First Disciples

35 Again the next day after John stood, and two of his disciples:\*

<sup>37</sup>And the two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus.

45Philip findeth Nathanael, and saith unto him, We have found him, of whom Moses in the law, and the prophets, did write, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph.

46 And Nathanael said unto him, Can there any good thing come out of Nazareth? Philip saith unto him. Come and see.

<sup>6</sup>And there were set there six waterpots of stone, after the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three firkins apiece.\*

<sup>7</sup>Jesus saith unto them. Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the

8 And he saith unto them. Draw out now, and bear unto the governor of the feast. And they bare it.\*

<sup>9</sup>When the ruler of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and knew not whence it was: (but the servants which drew the water knew:) the governor of the feast called the bride-

<sup>10</sup>and saith unto him, Every man at the beginning doth set forth good wine; and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now.\*

<sup>11</sup>This beginning of miracles did Jesus in that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Cana of Galilee, and manifested forth his glory; and his disciples believed on him.\*

<sup>12</sup>After this he went down to Capernaum. he, and his mother, and his brethren, and his disciples: and they continued there not many days.

#### Jesus Cleanses the Temple

<sup>13</sup>And the Jews' passover was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem,

<sup>14</sup>and found in the temple those that sold oxen and sheep and doves, and the changers of money sitting:

<sup>15</sup>and when he had made a scourge of small cords, he drove them all out of the temple, and the sheep, and the oxen; and poured out the changers' money, and overthrew the tables;\*

<sup>16</sup>and said unto them that sold doves, Take these things hence; make not my Father's house an house of merchandise.\*

> <sup>5</sup>Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit. he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.

> <sup>6</sup>That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and

<sup>7</sup>Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again.\*

8The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit.'

9Nicodemus answered and said unto him, How can these things be?

10 Jesus answered and said unto him. Art thou a master of Israel, and knowest not these things?\*

11 Verily, verily, I say unto thee, We speak that we do know, and testify that we have seen; and ve receive not our witness.

<sup>12</sup>If I have told you earthly things, and ye believe not, how shall ye believe, if I tell you of heavenly things?

<sup>13</sup>And no man hath ascended up to heaven, but he that came down from heaven, even the Son of man which is in heaven.

14 And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the Jesus and the Samaritan Woman wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up:

15that whosoever believeth in him should

not perish, but have eternal life.

<sup>16</sup>For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.\*

<sup>17</sup>For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through

him might be saved.

<sup>18</sup>He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already. because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.

<sup>19</sup>And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil.

<sup>20</sup>For every one that doeth evil hateth the light, neither cometh to the light, lest his deeds should be reproved.\*

<sup>21</sup>But he that doeth truth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made manifest, that they are wrought in God."

#### John the Baptist Exalts Jesus

<sup>22</sup>After these things came Jesus and his disciples into the land of Judaea; and there he tarried with them, and baptized.\*

<sup>23</sup>And John also was baptizing in Aenon near to Salim, because there was much water there: and they came, and were baptized.

<sup>24</sup>For John was not yet cast into prison.

<sup>25</sup>Then there arose a question between *some* of John's disciples and the Jews about purifying.\*

<sup>26</sup>And they came unto John, and said unto him. Rabbi, he that was with thee beyond Jorsame baptizeth, and all men come to him.

<sup>27</sup> John answered and said, A man can receive nothing, except it be given him from heaven.

am not the Christ, but that I am sent before him.

<sup>29</sup>He that hath the bride is the bridegroom: but the friend of the bridegroom, which standeth and heareth him, rejoiceth greatly because of the bridegroom's voice: this my joy therefore is fulfilled.

30 He must increase, but I must decrease.

<sup>31</sup>He that cometh from above is above all: he that is of the earth is earthly, and speaketh of the earth: he that cometh from heaven is above all.

32 And what he hath seen and heard, that he testifieth: and no man receiveth his testimony.

33He that hath received his testimony hath

set to his seal that God is true.\* 34For he whom God hath sent speaketh the

words of God: for God giveth not the Spirit by measure unto him.

35The Father loveth the Son, and hath given all things into his hand.

<sup>36</sup>He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him.\*

6Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore. being wearied with his journey, sat thus on the well: and it was about the sixth hour.\*

<sup>7</sup>There cometh a woman of Samaria to draw water: Jesus saith unto her, Give me to drink.

8(For his disciples were gone away unto the city to buy meat.)

<sup>9</sup>Then saith the woman of Samaria unto him, How is it that thou, being a Jew, askest drink of me, which am a woman of Samaria? for the Jews have no dealings with the Samaritans.

<sup>10</sup>Jesus answered and said unto her. If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of him, and he would have given thee living water.

And I heard a loud voice saying in heaven, Now is come salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of his Christ: for the accuser of our brethren is cast down, which accused them before our God day and night. (Revelation 12:10)

## Satan always accuses us of sin before God, but we are forgiven through the work of Jesus Christ on our behalf. Because of Jesus, Satan's accusations are meaningless.

Satan accuses God's people of doing wrong (Zechariah 3:1)

Jesus was falsely accused (Matthew 26:59-60)

Accusations must come from more than one person (1 Timothy 5:19)

#### **ADOPTION** (see SPIRITUAL ADOPTION)

#### **ADULTERY** (see also SEXUALITY)

Thou shalt not commit adultery. (Exodus 20:14)

But whoso committeth adultery with a woman lacketh understanding: he that doeth it destroyeth his own soul. (Proverbs 6:32)

#### God is very clear on adultery. It is expressly forbidden by God because it will destroy your life.

Adultery has consequences (Proverbs 6:26)

Adultery is disgusting to God (Jeremiah 7:9-10)

God considers lust to be as sinful as adultery (Matthew 5:27-28)

God will forgive an adulterer (John 8:1-11)

#### ADVICE (see also GUIDANCE)

Where no counsel is, the people fall: but in the multitude of counsellors there is safety. (Proverbs 11:14)

The way of a fool is right in his own eyes: but he that hearkeneth unto counsel is wise. (Proverbs 12:15) Wise people understand that they cannot know everything, and they demonstrate their wisdom by seeking good advice.

Leaders should consider the advice of others (Exodus 18:13-26)

Older people often give wise advice (1 Kings 12:1-11)

God's advice is best (Psalm 73:24)

Wise people seek advice (Proverbs 1:5)

#### ALCOHOL

Wine is a mocker, strong drink is raging: and whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise.

(Proverbs 20:1)

Let us walk honestly, as in the day; not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and wantonness, not in strife and envying. (Romans 13:13)

Alcohol used to excess can destroy a person's life. Avoid abusing it at all costs.

God hates drunkenness (Galatians 5:19-21)

Drinking too much alcohol can lead to immoral behavior (Ephesians 5:18)

Church leaders should not be controlled by alcohol (Titus 1:7)

#### AMBITION (see also PRIDE, SELF-ESTEEM)

And that ye study to be quiet, and to do your own business, and to work with your own hands, as we commanded you; that ye may walk honestly toward them that are without, and that ye may have lack of nothing. (1 Thessalonians 4:11-12)

But if ye have bitter envying and strife in your hearts, glory not, and lie not against the truth. This wisdom descendeth not from above, but is earthly, sensual, devilish. For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work. (James 3:14-16)

## If our highest ambition is to love God and our neighbour, we will live lives of quiet integrity with the goal of bringing glory to God.

Selfish ambition destroys relationships (Mark 10:35-45)

An important ambition is to spread God's Good News (Romans 15:20)

Making a good impression shouldn't be our highest goal (Philippians 2:3)

#### ANGER

Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath: neither give place to the devil. (Ephesians 4:26-27)

Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath. (James 1:19)

#### Don't let anger get a foothold in your life-let go of it for your own good.

Anger leads to evil actions (Psalm 37:8)

Gentle words can soothe anger (Proverbs 15:1)

Being quick-tempered is foolish (Ecclesiastes 7:9)

God considers anger to be as sinful as murder (Matthew 5:21-22)

#### **ARGUMENTS** (see also CONFLICT)

A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger. (Proverbs 15:1)

It is an honour for a man to cease from strife: but every fool will be meddling. (Proverbs 20:3)

Arguments destroy relationships between family members, friends, and fellow believers. Do what you can to avoid them, and seek peace.

Loving to argue is a sin (Proverbs 17:19)

We should avoid arguments (Philippians 2:14)

Arguments between Christians are useless (Titus 3:9)

**ARMOUR** (see SPIRITUAL ARMOUR)

#### ASSURANCE

I will make an everlasting covenant with them, that I will not turn away from them, to do them good; but I will put my fear in their hearts, that they shall not depart from me. Yea, I will rejoice over them to do them good, and I will plant them in this land assuredly with my whole heart and with my whole soul. (Jeremiah 32:40-41)

For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:38-39)
