Great and manifold were the blessings, most dread Sovereign, which Almighty God, the Father of all mercies, bestowed upon us the people of *England*, when first he sent Your Majesty's Royal Person to rule and reign over us. For whereas it was the expectation of many, who wished not well unto our *Sion*, that upon the setting of that bright *Occidental Star*, Queen *Elizabeth* of most happy memory, some thick and palpable clouds of darkness would so have overshadowed this Land, that men should have been in doubt which way they were to walk; and that it should hardly be known, who was to direct the unsettled State; the appearance of Your Majesty, as of the *Sun* in his strength, instantly dispelled those supposed and surmised mists, and gave unto all that were well affected exceeding cause of comfort; especially when we beheld the Government established in Your Highness, and Your hopeful Seed, by an undoubted Title, and this also accompanied with peace and tranquility at home and abroad.

But among all our joys, there was no one that more filled our hearts, than the blessed continuance of the preaching of God's sacred Word among us; which is that inestimable treasure, which excelleth all the riches of the earth; because the fruit thereof extendeth itself, not only to the time spent in this transitory world, but directeth and disposeth men unto that eternal happiness which is above in heaven.

Then not to suffer this to fall to the ground, but rather to take it up, and to continue it in that state, wherein the famous Predecessor of Your Highness did leave it: nay, to go forward with the confidence and resolution of a Man in maintaining the truth of Christ, and propagating it far and near, is that which hath so bound and firmly knit the hearts of all Your Majesty's loyal and religious people unto You, that Your very name is precious among them: their eye doth behold You with comfort, and they bless You in their hearts, as that sanctified Person who, under God, is the immediate Author of their true happiness. And this their contentment doth not diminish or decay, but every day increaseth and taketh strength, when they observe, that the zeal of Your Majesty toward the house of God doth not slack or go backward, but is more and more kindled, manifesting itself abroad in the farthest parts of *Christendom*, by writing in defence of the Truth, (which hath given such a blow unto that man of sin, as will not be healed,) and every day at home, by religious and learned discourse, by frequenting the house of God, by hearing the Word preached, by cherishing the Teachers thereof, by caring for the Church, as a most tender and loving nursing Father.

There are infinite arguments of this right Christian and religious affection in Your Majesty; but none is more forcible to declare it to others than the vehement and perpetuated desire of accomplishing and publishing of this work, which now with all humility we present unto Your Majesty. For when Your Highness had once out of deep judgment apprehended how convenient it was, that out of the Original Sacred Tongues, together with comparing of the labours, both in our own, and other foreign Languages, of many worthy men who went before us, there should be one more exact Translation of the holy Scriptures into the *English Tongue;* Your Majesty did never desist to urge and to excite those to whom it was commended, that the work might be hastened, and that the business might be expedited in so decent a manner, as a matter of such importance might justly require.

And now at last, by the mercy of God, and the continuance of our labours, it being brought unto such a conclusion, as that we have great hopes that the Church of *England* shall reap good fruit thereby; we hold it our duty to offer it to Your Majesty, not only as to our King and Sovereign, but as to the principal Mover and Author of the work: humbly craving of Your most Sacred Majesty, that since things of this quality have ever been subject to the censures of illmeaning and discontented persons, it may receive approbation and patronage from so learned and judicious a Prince as Your Highness is, whose allowance and acceptance of our labours shall more honour and encourage us, than all the calumniations and hard interpretations of other men shall dismay us. So that if, on the one side, we shall be traduced by Popish Persons at home or abroad, who therefore will malign us, because we are poor instruments to make God's holy Truth to be yet more and more known unto the people, whom they desire still to keep in ignorance and darkness; or if, on the other side, we shall be maligned by self-conceited Brethren, who run their own ways, and give liking unto nothing, but what is framed by themselves, and hammered on their anvil; we may rest secure, supported within by the truth and innocency of a good conscience, having walked the ways of simplicity and integrity, as before the Lord; and sustained without by the powerful protection of Your Majesty's grace and favour, which will ever give countenance to honest and Christian endeavours against bitter censures and uncharitable imputations.

The Lord of heaven and earth bless Your Majesty with many and happy days, that, as his heavenly hand hath enriched Your Highness with many singular and extraordinary graces, so You may be the wonder of the world in this latter age for happiness and true felicity, to the honour of that great GOD, and the good of his Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord and only Saviour.

The First Book of Moses, Called Genesis

The creation

1 In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth. *Jb 38:4; Heb 11:3*

2 And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness *was* upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.

3 And God said, Let there be light: and there was light. *Ps 33:6, 9; 2 Cor 4:6*

4 And God saw the light, that *it was* good: and God divided ^a the light from the darkness.

5 And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. ^{*b*} And the evening and the morning were the first day.

6 ¶ And God said, Let there be a ^c firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters. Jb 37:18

7 And God made the firmament, and divided the waters which *were* under the firmament from the waters which *were* above the firmament: and it was so.

8 And God called the firmament Heaven. And the evening and the morning were the second day. *Gn* 1:5

9¶ And God said, Let the waters under the heaven be gathered together unto one place, and let the dry *land* appear: and it was so. *Jb* 38:8-11 10 And God called the dry *land* Earth; and the gathering together of

the waters called he Seas: and God saw that *it was* good.

11 And God said, Let the earth bring forth ^{*d*} grass, the herb yielding seed, *and* the fruit tree yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed *is* in itself, upon the earth: and it was so. *Heb* 6:7

12 And the earth brought forth grass, and herb yielding seed after his kind, and the tree yielding fruit, whose seed was in itself, after his kind: and God saw that *it was* good.

13 And the evening and the morning were the third day.

14 ¶ And God said, Let there be lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide ^e the day from the night; and let them be for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years: *Is 40:26*

15 And let them be for lights in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth: and it was so.

16 And God made two great lights; the greater light 'to rule the day, and the lesser light to rule the night: *he made* the stars also. *Jb* 38:7

17 And God set them in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth,

18 And to rule over the day and over the night, and to divide the

light from the darkness: and God saw that *it was* good.

19 And the evening and the morning were the fourth day.

20 ¶ And God said, Let the waters bring forth abundantly the ^amoving ^bcreature that hath life, and ^cfowl *that* may fly above the earth in the ^dopen firmament of heaven.

21 And God created great whales, and every living creature that moveth, which the waters brought forth abundantly, after their kind, and every winged fowl after his kind: and God saw that *it was* good.

22 And God blessed them, saying, Be fruitful, and multiply, and fill the waters in the seas, and let fowl multiply in the earth.

23 And the evening and the morning were the fifth day.

24 ¶ And God said, Let the earth bring forth the living creature after his kind, cattle, and creeping thing, and beast of the earth after his kind: and it was so.

25 And God made the beast of the earth after his kind, and cattle after their kind, and every thing that creepeth upon the earth after his kind: and God saw that *it was* good.

26 ¶ And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth. $G_{n\,9.6}$ **27** So God created man in his *own* image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.

28 ¶ And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that e moveth upon the earth. *Gn* 9:1, 7

29 And God said, Behold, I have given you every herb 'bearing seed, which *is* upon the face of all the earth, and every tree, in the which *is* the fruit of a tree ^{*g*} yielding seed; to you it shall be for meat.

30 And to every beast of the earth, and to every fowl of the air, and to every thing that creepeth upon the earth, wherein *there is h*life, *I have given* every green herb for meat: and it was so. *Ps 147:9*

31 And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, *it was* very good. And the evening and the morning were the sixth day. *Ps* 104:24

2 Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them.

2 And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made. *Ex 31:17; Dt 5:14*

3 And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he

had rested from all his work which God ^a created and made. Lv 23:3

Adam and Eve

4 These *are* the generations of the heavens and of the earth when they were created, in the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens,

5 And every plant of the field before it was in the earth, and every herb of the field before it grew: for the LORD God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and *there was* not a man to till the ground.

6 But ^{*b*} there went up a mist from the earth, and watered the whole face of the ground.

7 And the LORD God formed man ^c of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.

8 And the LORD God planted a garden eastward in Eden; and there he put the man whom he had formed. *Gn* 13:10

9 And out of the ground made the LORD God to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of knowledge of good and evil. *Gn 3:22; Rv 2:7; 22:2*

10 And a river went out of Eden to water the garden; and from thence it was parted, and became into four heads.

11 The name of the first *is* Pison: that *is* it which compasseth the whole land of Havilah, where *there is* gold;

12 And the gold of that land *is* good: there *is* bdellium and the onyx stone.

13 And the name of the second river *is* Gihon: the same *is* it that compasseth the whole land of ^{*d*} Ethiopia.

14 And the name of the third river *is* Hiddekel: that *is* it which goeth ^etoward the east of Assyria. And the fourth river *is* Euphrates. *Gn* 15:18; *Dn* 10:4

15 ¶ And the LORD God took ^{*t*} the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it. Gn 2:8

16 And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden ^{*g*} thou mayest freely eat:

17 But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof ^{*h*} thou shalt surely die. *Gn 3:19*

18 ¶ And the LORD God said, *It is* not good that the man should be alone; I will make him an help 'meet for him.

19 And out of the ground the LORD God formed every beast of the field, and every fowl of the air; and brought *them* unto ^{*i*}Adam to see what he would call them: and whatsoever Adam called every living creature, that *was* the name thereof. *Gn* 1:28

20 And Adam ^{*k*} gave names to all cattle, and to the fowl of the air, and to every beast of the field; but for Adam there was not found an help meet for him.

21 And the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept:

and he took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof; Gn 15:12

22 And the rib, which the LORD God had taken from man, ^amade he a woman, and brought her unto the man.

23 And Adam said, This *is* now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called ^bWoman, because she was taken out of ^cMan. *Gn 29:14; Jgs 9:2*

24 Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh.

25 And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed.

The fall of man

3 Now the serpent was more subtil than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said unto the woman, ^{*d*}Yea, hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden? *Rv 12:9*

2 And the woman said unto the serpent, We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden:

3 But of the fruit of the tree which *is* in the midst of the garden, God hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, lest ye die.

4 And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die: Jn 8:44

5 For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil. Ez 28:2

6 And when the woman saw that the tree *was* good for food, and that it *was* ^epleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make *one* wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat. *Jo* 7:21; 1 Tm 2:14; 1 Jn 2:16

7 And the eyes of them both were opened, and they knew that they *were* naked; and they sewed fig leaves together, and made themselves ^faprons.

8 ¶ And they heard the voice of the LORD God walking in the garden in the ^g cool of the day: and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God amongst the trees of the garden. Jb 31:33 **9** And the LORD God called unto Adam, and said unto him, Where art thou?

10 And he said, I heard thy voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself. *Gn 2:25; 3:7*

11 And he said, Who told thee that thou *wast* naked? Hast thou eaten of the tree, whereof I commanded thee that thou shouldest not eat?

12 And the man said, The woman whom thou gavest *to be* with me, she gave me of the tree, and I did eat.

13 And the LORD God said unto the woman, What *is* this *that* thou hast done? And the woman said, The serpent beguiled me, and I did eat.

14 ¶ And the LORD God said unto the serpent, Because thou hast done this, thou *art* cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life: *Is 65:25*

15 And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel. *Bom 16:20*

16 Unto the woman he said, I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire *shall be*^a to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee.

17 And unto Adam he said, Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed *is* the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat *of* it all the days of thy life;

18 Thorns also and thistles shall it ^{*b*} bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field;

19 In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou *art*, and unto dust shalt thou return. *Gn 2:7; Ps 104:29; Eccl 12:7*

20 ¶ And Adam called his wife's name c Eve; because she was the mother of all living. Gn 2:20

21 Unto Adam also and to his wife did the LORD God make coats of skins, and clothed them.

22 ¶ And the LORD God said, Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil: and now, lest he put forth his hand, and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever: Gn 1:26

23 Therefore the LORD God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken.

24 So he drove out the man; and he placed at the east of the garden of Eden Cherubims, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to keep the way of the tree of life. *Ex 25:18-22; Ps 104:4*

Cain and Abel

4 And Adam knew Eve his wife; and she conceived, and bare ^{*d*}Cain, and said, I have gotten a man from the LORD.

2 And she again bare his brother ^eAbel. And Abel was ^fa keeper of sheep, but Cain was a tiller of the ground. *Gn 47:3*

3 And ^{*g*} in process of time it came to pass, that Cain brought of the fruit of the ground an offering unto the LORD.

4 And Abel, he also brought of the firstlings of his *"*flock and of the fat thereof. And the LORD had respect unto Abel and to his offering: *Ex 13:12*

5 But unto Cain and to his offering he had not respect. And Cain was very wroth, and his countenance fell.

6 And the LORD said unto Cain, Why art thou wroth? and why is thy countenance fallen?

7 If thou doest well, shalt thou not "be accepted? and if thou doest not well, sin lieth at the door. And "unto thee *shall be* his desire, and thou shalt rule over him.

8¶ And Cain talked with Abel his brother: and it came to pass, when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother, and slew him.

9 And the LORD said unto Cain, Where *is* Abel thy brother? And he said, I know not: *Am* I my brother's keeper?

10 And he said, What hast thou done? the voice of thy brother's ^c blood crieth unto me from the ground. *Heb* 12:24

11 And now *art* thou cursed from the earth, which hath opened her mouth to receive thy brother's blood from thy hand; *Gn 3:14*

12 When thou tillest the ground, it shall not henceforth yield unto thee her strength; a fugitive and a vagabond shalt thou be in the earth. L_{V} 26:36

13 And Cain said unto the LORD, ^{*d*}My punishment *is* greater than I can bear.

14 Behold, thou hast driven me out this day from the face of the earth; and from thy face shall I be hid; and I shall be a fugitive and a vagabond in the earth; and it shall come to pass, *that* every one that findeth me shall slay me.

15 And the LORD said unto him, Therefore whosoever slayeth Cain, vengeance shall be taken on him sevenfold. And the LORD set a mark upon Cain, lest any finding him should kill him. *Gn 4:24; Ez 9:4, 6*

16 ¶ And Cain went out from the presence of the LORD, and dwelt in the land of Nod, on the east of Eden.

17 And Cain knew his wife; and she conceived, and bare "Enoch: and he builded a city, and called the name of the city, after the name of his son, Enoch.

18 And unto Enoch was born Irad: and Irad begat Mehujael: and Mehujael begat Methusael: and Methusael begat ^rLamech.

19 ¶ And Lamech took unto him two wives: the name of the one *was* Adah, and the name of the other Zillah. *Gn* 2:24

20 And Adah bare Jabal: he was the father of such as dwell in tents, and *of such as have* cattle.

21 And his brother's name *was* Jubal: he was the father of all such as handle the harp and organ.

22 And Zillah, she also bare Tubalcain, an ^{*g*}instructer of every artificer in brass and iron: and the sister of Tubal-cain *was* Naamah.

23 And Lamech said unto his wives, Adah and Zillah, Hear my voice; Ye wives of Lamech, hearken unto my speech:

For ^{*h*}I have slain a man to my wounding,

And a young man 'to my hurt.

26 And to Seth, to him also there was born a son; and he called his name ^bEnos: then began men ^c to call upon the name of the LORD. 1 Kgs 18:24; Ps 116:17

The descendants of Adam

5 This *is* the book of the generations of Adam. In the day that God created man, in the likeness of God made he him;

2 Male and female created he them; and blessed them, and called their name Adam, in the day when they were created. *Gn 1:27*

3 ¶ And Adam lived an hundred and thirty years, and begat *a son* in his own likeness, after his image; and called his name Seth: Gn 4:25

4 And the days of Adam after he had begotten Seth were eight hundred years: and he begat sons and daughters:

5 And all the days that Adam lived were nine hundred and thirty years: and he died. *Gn 3:19*

6 And Seth lived an hundred and five years, and begat ^{*d*}Enos: *Gn* 4:26

7 And Seth lived after he begat Enos eight hundred and seven years, and begat sons and daughters:

8 And all the days of Seth were nine hundred and twelve years: and he died.

9 ¶ And Enos lived ninety years, and begat ^eCainan:

10 And Enos lived after he begat Cainan eight hundred and fifteen years, and begat sons and daughters:

11 And all the days of Enos were nine hundred and five years: and he died.

12 ¶ And Cainan lived seventy years, and begat ^{*t*} Mahalaleel:

13 And Cainan lived after he begat Mahalaleel eight hundred and forty years, and begat sons and daughters:

14 And all the days of Cainan were nine hundred and ten years: and he died.

15 ¶ And Mahalaleel lived sixty and five years, and begat ^{*g*}Jared:

16 And Mahalaleel lived after he begat Jared eight hundred and thirty years, and begat sons and daughters:

17 And all the days of Mahalaleel were eight hundred ninety and five years: and he died.

18 ¶ And Jared lived an hundred sixty and two years, and he begat Enoch:

19 And Jared lived after he begat Enoch eight hundred years, and begat sons and daughters:

20 And all the days of Jared were nine hundred sixty and two years: and he died.

21 ¶ And Enoch lived sixty and five years, and begat ^{*n*}Methuselah:

22 And Enoch walked with God after he begat Methuselah three hundred years, and begat sons and daughters:

23 And all the days of Enoch were three hundred sixty and five years:

24 And Enoch walked with God: and he *was* not; for God took him.

25 And Methuselah lived an hundred eighty and seven years, and begat Lamech:

26 And Methuselah lived after he begat ^aLamech seven hundred eighty and two years, and begat sons and daughters:

27 And all the days of Methuselah were nine hundred sixty and nine years: and he died.

28 ¶ And Lamech lived an hundred eighty and two years, and begat a son:

29 And he called his name ^bNoah, saying, This *same* shall comfort us concerning our work and toil of our hands, because of the ground which the LORD hath cursed. *Gn 3:17-19*

30 And Lamech lived after he begat Noah five hundred ninety and five years, and begat sons and daughters:

31 And all the days of Lamech were seven hundred seventy and seven years: and he died.

32 And Noah was five hundred years old: and Noah begat Shem, Ham, and Japheth. *Gn 6:10*

The flood

6 And it came to pass, when men began to multiply on the face of the earth, and daughters were born unto them, Gn 1:28

2 That the sons of God saw the daughters of men that they *were* fair; and they took them wives of all which they chose.

3 And the LORD said, My spirit shall not always strive with man, for that he also *is* flesh: yet his days shall be an hundred and twenty years. *Neh* 9:30

4 There were giants in the earth in those days; and also after that, when the sons of God came in unto the daughters of men, and they bare *children* to them, the same *became* mighty men which *were* of old, men of renown.

5 ¶ And GOD saw that the wickedness of man *was* great in the earth, and *that* ^c every imagination of the thoughts of his heart *was* only evil ^d continually. *Prv6:18*

6 And it repented the LORD that he had made man on the earth, and it grieved him at his heart. *2 Sm 24:16; Is 63:10*

7 And the LORD said, I will destroy man whom I have created from the face of the earth; ^eboth man, and beast, and the creeping thing, and the fowls of the air; for it repenteth me that I have made them.

8 But Noah found grace in the eyes of the LORD. Gn 19:19; Lk 1:30; Acts 7:46 **9** These are the generations of Noah: Noah was a just man and ^fperfect in his generations, and Noah walked with God.

10 And Noah begat three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth. *Gn 5:32*

11 The earth also was corrupt before God, and the earth was filled with violence.

12 And God looked upon the earth, and, behold, it was corrupt; for all flesh had corrupted his way upon the earth.

13 And God said unto Noah, The end of all flesh is come before me; for the earth is filled with violence through them; and, behold, I will destroy them ^a with the earth. Am 8:2

14 ¶ Make thee an ark of gopher wood; ^{*b*} rooms shalt thou make in the ark, and shalt pitch it within and without with pitch. $E_{x 2:3}$

15 And this *is the fashion* which thou shalt make it *of:* The length of the ark *shall be* three hundred cubits, the breadth of it fifty cubits, and the height of it thirty cubits.

16 A window shalt thou make to the ark, and in a cubit shalt thou finish it above; and the door of the ark shalt thou set in the side thereof; *with* lower, second, and third *stories* shalt thou make it.

17 And, behold, I, even I, do bring a flood of waters upon the earth, to destroy all flesh, wherein *is* the breath of life, from under heaven; *and* every thing that *is* in the earth shall die. *Gn* 7:4

18 But with thee will I establish my covenant; and thou shalt come into the ark, thou, and thy sons, and thy wife, and thy sons' wives with thee.

19 And of every living thing of all flesh, two of every *sort* shalt thou bring into the ark, to keep *them* alive with thee; they shall be male and female.

20 Of fowls after their kind, and of cattle after their kind, of every creeping thing of the earth after his kind, two of every *sort* shall come unto thee, to keep *them* alive.

21 And take thou unto thee of all food that is eaten, and thou shalt gather *it* to thee; and it shall be for food for thee, and for them. *Gn* 1:29-30

22 Thus did Noah; according to all that God commanded him, so did he.

7 And the LORD said unto Noah, Come thou and all thy house into the ark; for thee have I seen righteous before me in this generation. *Gn* 6:9; 7:7, 13

2 Of every clean beast thou shalt take to thee ^c by sevens, the male and his female: and of beasts that *are* not clean by two, the male and his female.

3 Of fowls also of the air ^{*d*} by sevens, the male and the female; to keep seed alive upon the face of all the earth.

4 For yet seven days, and I will cause it to rain upon the earth forty days and forty nights; and every living substance that I have made will I ^e destroy from off the face of the earth. *Gn 6:17*

5 And Noah did according unto all that the LORD commanded him. *Gn* 6:22

6 And Noah *was* six hundred years old when the flood of waters was upon the earth. *Gn 5:32*

7 ¶ And Noah went in, and his sons, and his wife, and his sons' wives with him, into the ark, because of the waters of the flood. *Gn 6:18*

8 Of clean beasts, and of beasts that *are* not clean, and of fowls, and of every thing that creepeth upon the earth,

9 There went in two and two unto Noah into the ark, the male and the female, as God had commanded Noah.

10 And it came to pass ^a after seven days, that the waters of the flood were upon the earth. *Gn 7:4*

11 ¶ In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, in the second month, the seventeenth day of the month, the same day were all the fountains of the great deep broken up, and the ^bwindows of heaven were opened.

12 And the rain was upon the earth forty days and forty nights. *Gn 7.4*

13 In the selfsame day entered Noah, and Shem, and Ham, and Japheth, the sons of Noah, and Noah's wife, and the three wives of his sons with them, into the ark;

14 They, and every beast after his kind, and all the cattle after their kind, and every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth after his kind, and every fowl after his kind, every bird of every ^c sort.

15 Ánd they went in unto Noah into the ark, two and two of all flesh, wherein *is* the breath of life.

16 And they that went in, went in male and female of all flesh, as God

had commanded him: and the LORD shut him in.

17 And the flood was forty days upon the earth; and the waters increased, and bare up the ark, and it was lift up above the earth. *Gn 7:4, 12*

18 And the waters prevailed, and were increased greatly upon the earth; and the ark went upon the face of the waters.

19 And the waters prevailed exceedingly upon the earth; and all the high hills, that *were* under the whole heaven, were covered.

20 Fifteen cubits upward did the waters prevail; and the mountains were covered.

21 And all flesh died that moved upon the earth, both of fowl, and of cattle, and of beast, and of every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth, and every man:

22 All in whose nostrils was ^{*d*} the breath of life, of all that was in the dry *land*, died.

23 And every living substance was destroyed which was upon the face of the ground, both man, and cattle, and the creeping things, and the fowl of the heaven; and they were destroyed from the earth: and Noah only remained *alive*, and they that *were* with him in the ark.

24 And the waters prevailed upon the earth an hundred and fifty days.

8 And God remembered Noah, and every living thing, and all the cattle that *was* with him in the ark: and God made a wind to pass over the earth, and the waters asswaged; *Gn 19:29; Ex 2:24*

2 The fountains also of the deep and the windows of heaven were stopped, and the rain from heaven was restrained;

3 And the waters returned from off the earth ^a continually: and after the end of the hundred and fifty days the waters were abated. *Gn 7:24*

4 And the ark rested in the seventh month, on the seventeenth day of the month, upon the mountains of Ararat.

5 And the waters ^bdecreased continually until the tenth month: in the tenth *month*, on the first *day* of the month, were the tops of the mountains seen.

6 \P And it came to pass at the end of forty days, that Noah opened the window of the ark which he had made: *Gn6:16*

7 And he sent forth a raven, which went forth ^{*c*} to and fro, until the waters were dried up from off the earth.

8 Also he sent forth a dove from him, to see if the waters were abated from off the face of the ground;

9 But the dove found no rest for the sole of her foot, and she returned unto him into the ark, for the waters *were* on the face of the whole earth: then he put forth his hand, and took her, and ^{*a*} pulled her in unto him into the ark.

10 And he stayed yet other seven days; and again he sent forth the dove out of the ark;

11 And the dove came in to him in the evening; and, lo, in her mouth *was* an olive leaf pluckt off: so Noah knew that the waters were abated from off the earth.

12 And he stayed yet other seven days; and sent forth the dove; which returned not again unto him any more.

13 ¶ And it came to pass in the six hundredth and first year, in the first *month*, the first *day* of the month, the waters were dried up from off the earth: and Noah removed the covering of the ark, and looked, and, behold, the face of the ground was dry.

14 And in the second month, on the seven and twentieth day of the month, was the earth dried.

15 ¶ And God spake unto Noah, saying,

16 Go forth of the ark, thou, and thy wife, and thy sons, and thy sons' wives with thee.

17 Bring forth with thee every living thing that *is* with thee, of all flesh, *both* of fowl, and of cattle, and of every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth; that they may breed abundantly in the earth, and be fruitful, and multiply upon the earth. *Gn* 1:22

18 And Noah went forth, and his sons, and his wife, and his sons' wives with him:

8:3 *a* Heb. *in going and returning* **8:5** *b* Heb. *were in going and decreasing* **8:7** *c* Heb. *in going forth and returning* **8:9** *d* Heb. *caused her to come*

19 Every beast, every creeping thing, and every fowl, *and* whatsoever creepeth upon the earth, after their ^{*a*}kinds, went forth out of the ark.

20 ¶ And Noah builded an altar unto the LORD; and took of every clean beast, and of every clean fowl, and offered burnt-offerings on the altar.

21 And the LORD smelled ^ba sweet savour; and the LORD said in his heart, I will not again curse the ground any more for man's sake; ^c for the imagination of man's heart *is* evil from his youth; neither will I again smite any more every thing living, as I have done. *Gn* 3:17; 6:5; *Jer* 17:9

22 ^{*d*}While the earth remaineth, seedtime and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease. *Jer 5:24*

The covenant with Noah

9 And God blessed Noah and his sons, and said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth.

2 And the fear of you and the dread of you shall be upon every beast of the earth, and upon every fowl of the air, upon all that moveth *upon* the earth, and upon all the fishes of the sea; into your hand are they delivered. Jas 3:7

3 Every moving thing that liveth shall be meat for you; even as the green herb have I given you all things.

4 But flesh with the life thereof, *which is* the blood thereof, shall ye not eat.

5 And surely your blood of your lives will I require; at the hand of every

beast will I require it, and at the hand of man; at the hand of every man's brother will I require the life of man.

6 Whoso sheddeth man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed: for in the image of God made he man. *Gn 1:26-27*

7 And you, be ye fruitful, and multiply; bring forth abundantly in the earth, and multiply therein. *Gn* 9:1

8 ¶ And God spake unto Noah, and to his sons with him, saying,

9 And I, behold, I establish my covenant with you, and with your seed after you; *Gn 6:18*

10 And with every living creature that *is* with you, of the fowl, of the cattle, and of every beast of the earth with you; from all that go out of the ark, to every beast of the earth.

11 And I will establish my covenant with you; neither shall all flesh be cut off any more by the waters of a flood; neither shall there any more be a flood to destroy the earth. *Gn 8:21-22; ls 54:9*

12 And God said, This *is* the token of the covenant which I make between me and you and every living creature that *is* with you, for perpetual generations:

13 I do set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be for a token of a covenant between me and the earth. *Ez 1:28*

14 And it shall come to pass, when I bring a cloud over the earth, that the bow shall be seen in the cloud:

15 And I will remember my covenant, which *is* between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall no more become a flood to destroy all flesh. *Dt 7:9; 1 Kgs 8:23*

16 And the bow shall be in the cloud; and I will look upon it, that I may remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that *is* upon the earth.

17 And God said unto Noah, This *is* the token of the covenant, which I have established between me and all flesh that *is* upon the earth.

Canaan cursed; Shem blessed

18 ¶ And the sons of Noah, that went forth of the ark, were Shem, and Ham, and Japheth: and Ham *is* the father of ^aCanaan. Gn 10:1, 6

19 These *are* the three sons of Noah: and of them was the whole earth overspread.

20 And Noah began *to be* an husbandman, and he planted a vineyard:

21 And he drank of the wine, and was drunken; and he was uncovered within his tent. *Prv 20:1*

22 And Ham, the father of Canaan, saw the nakedness of his father, and told his two brethren without.

23 And Shem and Japheth took a garment, and laid *it* upon both their shoulders, and went backward, and covered the nakedness of their father; and their faces *were* backward, and they saw not their father's nakedness.

24 And Noah awoke from his wine, and knew what his younger son had done unto him.

25 And he said,

Cursed be Canaan;

A servant of servants shall he be

unto his brethren. Jo 9:23; Jn 8:34

- 26 And he said, Blessed be the LORD God of Shem; And Canaan shall be ^bhis servant.
- 27 God shall ^cenlarge Japheth, And he shall dwell in the tents of Shem;

And Canaan shall be his servant.

28 ¶ And Noah lived after the flood three hundred and fifty years.

29 And all the days of Noah were nine hundred and fifty years: and he died.

Descendants of Noah's sons

10 Now these *are* the generations of the sons of Noah, Shem, Ham, and Japheth: and unto them were sons born after the flood. *Gn 2:4*

2 The sons of Japheth; Gomer, and Magog, and Madai, and Javan, and Tubal, and Meshech, and Tiras. *Ez 38:2, 6*

3 And the sons of Gomer; Ashkenaz, and Riphath, and Togarmah.

4 And the sons of Javan; Elishah, and Tarshish, Kittim, and ^{*d*}Dodanim.

5 By these were the isles of the Gentiles divided in their lands; every one after his tongue, after their families, in their nations.

6 [¶] And the sons of Ham; Cush, and Mizraim, and Phut, and Canaan.

7 And the sons of Cush; Seba, and Havilah, and Sabtah, and Raamah, and Sabtechah: and the sons of Raamah; Sheba, and Dedan. *Ez 27:22*

8 And Cush begat Nimrod: he began to be a mighty one in the earth.

9 He was a mighty hunter before the LORD: wherefore it is said, Even as Nimrod the mighty hunter before the LORD.

10 And the beginning of his kingdom was ^a Babel, and Erech, and Accad, and Calneh, in the land of Shinar.

11 Out of that land ^bwent forth Asshur, and builded Nineveh, and ^cthe city Rehoboth, and Calah, *Mi5:6*

12 And Resen between Nineveh and Calah: the same *is* a great city.

13 And Mizraim begat Ludim, and Anamim, and Lehabim, and Naphtuhim,

14 And Pathrusim, and Casluhim, (out of whom came Philistim,) and Caphtorim. *Dt 2:23; 1 Chr 1:12; Jer 47:4*

15 ¶ And Canaan begat ^{*d*}Sidon his firstborn, and Heth, *Gn* 15:18-21

16 And the Jebusite, and the Amorite, and the Girgasite,

17 And the Hivite, and the Arkite, and the Sinite,

18 And the Arvadite, and the Zemarite, and the Hamathite: and afterward were the families of the Canaanites spread abroad.

19 And the border of the Canaanites was from Sidon, as thou comest to Gerar, unto ^eGaza; as thou goest, unto Sodom, and Gomorrah, and Admah, and Zeboim, even unto Lasha. *Gn* 14:2

20 These *are* the sons of Ham, after their families, after their tongues, in their countries, *and* in their nations.

21 ¶ Unto Shem also, the father of all the children of Eber, the brother of Japheth the elder, even to him were *children* born. *Nm* 24:24

22 The children of Shem; Elam, and Asshur, and ^{*t*}Arphaxad, and Lud, and Aram.

23 And the children of Aram; Uz, and Hul, and Gether, and Mash. *Jb* 1:1

24 And Arphaxad begat ^{*g*}Salah; and Salah begat Eber.

25 And unto Eber were born two sons: the name of one *was* ^{*h*} Peleg; for in his days was the earth divided; and his brother's name *was* loktan. *1 chr 1:19*

26 And Joktan begat Almodad, and Sheleph, and Hazarmaveth, and Jerah,

27 And Hadoram, and Uzal, and Diklah,

28 And Obal, and Abimael, and Sheba,

29 And Ophir, and Havilah, and Jobab: all these *were* the sons of Joktan.

30 And their dwelling was from Mesha, as thou goest unto Sephar a mount of the east.

31 These *are* the sons of Shem, after their families, after their tongues, in their lands, after their nations. *Gn* 10:5

The tower of Babel

11 And the whole earth was of one ^a language, and of one ^b speech.

2 And it came to pass, as they journeyed ^c from the east, that they found a plain in the land of Shinar; and they dwelt there. *Gn 10:10; 14:1; Dn 1:2*

3 And ^{*a*} they said one to another, Go to, let us make brick, and ^{*e*} burn them throughly. And they had brick for stone, and slime had they for morter.

4 And they said, Go to, let us build us a city and a tower, whose top *may reach* unto heaven; and let us make us a name, lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth. *Dt* 1:28

5 And the LORD came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of men builded. *Gn* 18:21; *Ex* 19:11

6 And the LORD said, Behold, the people *is* one, and they have all one language; and this they begin to do: and now nothing will be restrained from them, which they have imagined to do.

7 Go to, let us go down, and there confound their language, that they may not understand one another's speech.

8 So the LORD scattered them abroad from thence upon the face of all the earth: and they left off to build the city.

9 Therefore is the name of it called 'Babel; because the LORD did there confound the language of all the earth: and from thence did the LORD scatter them abroad upon the face of all the earth.

The descendants of Shem

10 These *are* the generations of Shem: Shem *was* an hundred years old, and begat Arphaxad two years after the flood: 1 Chr 1:17-27

11 And Shem lived after he begat Arphaxad five hundred years, and begat sons and daughters.

12 And Arphaxad lived five and thirty years, and begat Salah:

13 And Arphaxad lived after he begat Salah four hundred and three years, and begat sons and daughters.

14 And Salah lived thirty years, and begat Eber:

15 And Salah lived after he begat Eber four hundred and three years, and begat sons and daughters.

16 And Eber lived four and thirty years, and begat ^{*g*} Peleg:

17 And Eber lived after he begat Peleg four hundred and thirty years, and begat sons and daughters.

18 And Peleg lived thirty years, and begat Reu:

19 And Peleg lived after he begat Reu two hundred and nine years, and begat sons and daughters.

20 And Reu lived two and thirty years, and begat ^aSerug: *Lk 3:35*

21 And Reu lived after he begat Serug two hundred and seven years, and begat sons and daughters.

22 And Serug lived thirty years, and begat Nahor:

23 And Serug lived after he begat Nahor two hundred years, and begat sons and daughters.

24 And Nahor lived nine and twenty years, and begat ^bTerah: Lk 3:34

25 And Nahor lived after he begat Terah an hundred and nineteen years, and begat sons and daughters.

26 And Terah lived seventy years, and begat Abram, Nahor, and Haran.

27 ¶ Now these *are* the generations of Terah: Terah begat Abram, Nahor, and Haran; and Haran begat Lot.

28 And Haran died before his father Terah in the land of his nativity, in Ur of the Chaldees. *Gn 15:7*

29 And Abram and Nahor took them wives: the name of Abram's wife *was* Sarai; and the name of Nahor's wife, Milcah, the daughter of Haran, the father of Milcah, and the father of Iscah.

30 But Sarai was barren; she *had* no child.

31 And Terah took Abram his son, and Lot the son of Haran his son's son, and Sarai his daughter in law, his son Abram's wife; and they went forth with them from Ur of the Chaldees, to go into the land of Canaan; and they came unto Haran, and dwelt there. *Gn 24:10; Neh 9:7; Acts 7:2-4*

32 And the days of Terah were two hundred and five years: and Terah died in Haran.

The call of Abram

12 Now the LORD had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee: Gn 15:7; Heb 11:8

2 And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing:

3 And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed. *Gn 22:18; 26:4; 27:29*

4 So Abram departed, as the LORD had spoken unto him; and Lot went with him: and Abram *was* seventy and five years old when he departed out of Haran. *Gn 11:27*

5 And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their substance that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they went forth to go into the land of Canaan; and into the land of Canaan they came.

6 ¶ And Abram passed through the land unto the place of Sichem, unto the plain of Moreh. And the Canaanite *was* then in the land. Gn 35:4

7 And the LORD appeared unto Abram, and said, Unto thy seed will I give this land: and there builded he an altar unto the LORD, who appeared unto him.

8 And he removed from thence unto a mountain on the east of Beth-el, and pitched his tent, *having* Beth-el on the west, and Hai on the east: and there he builded an altar unto the LORD, and called upon the name of the LORD. *Gn 4:26*

9 And Abram journeyed, ^a going on still toward the south. *Gn 13:3*

Abram goes to Egypt

10 \P And there was a famine in the land: and Abram went down into Egypt to sojourn there; for the famine *was* grievous in the land. *Gn 43:1*

11 And it came to pass, when he was come near to enter into Egypt, that he said unto Sarai his wife, Behold now, I know that thou *art* a fair woman to look upon:

12 Therefore it shall come to pass, when the Egyptians shall see thee, that they shall say, This *is* his wife: and they will kill me, but they will save thee alive.

13 Say, I pray thee, thou *art* my sister: that it may be well with me for thy sake; and my soul shall live because of thee.

14 \P And it came to pass, that, when Abram was come into Egypt, the Egyptians beheld the woman that she *was* very fair.

15 The princes also of Pharaoh saw her, and commended her before Pharaoh: and the woman was taken into Pharaoh's house. *Gn 20:2*

16 And he entreated Abram well for her sake: and he had sheep, and

oxen, and he asses, and menservants, and maidservants, and she asses, and camels. *Gn 13:2*

17 And the LORD plagued Pharaoh and his house with great plagues because of Sarai Abram's wife. *Gn 20:18*

18 And Pharaoh called Abram, and said, What *is* this *that* thou hast done unto me? why didst thou not tell me that she *was* thy wife? *Gn 20:9-10*

19 Why saidst thou, She *is* my sister? so I might have taken her to me to wife: now therefore behold thy wife, take *her*, and go thy way.

20 And Pharaoh commanded *his* men concerning him: and they sent him away, and his wife, and all that he had.

Abram and Lot part

13 And Abram went up out of Egypt, he, and his wife, and all that he had, and Lot with him, into the south.

2 And Abram *was* very rich in cattle, in silver, and in gold. *Gn 24:35*

3 And he went on his journeys from the south even to Beth-el, unto the place where his tent had been at the beginning, between Beth-el and Hai;

4 Unto the place of the altar, which he had made there at the first: and there Abram called on the name of the LORD.

5¶ And Lot also, which went with Abram, had flocks, and herds, and tents.

6 And the land was not able to bear them, that they might dwell together:

for their substance was great, so that they could not dwell together. Gn 36:6-7

7 Ånd there was a strife between the herdmen of Abram's cattle and the herdmen of Lot's cattle: and the Canaanite and the Perizzite dwelled then in the land. *Gn 12:6; 26:20*

8 And Abram said unto Lot, Let there be no strife, I pray thee, between me and thee, and between my herdmen and thy herdmen; for we *be* ^abrethren.

9 *Is* not the whole land before thee? separate thyself, I pray thee, from me: if *thou wilt take* the left hand, then I will go to the right; or if *thou depart* to the right hand, then I will go to the left. *Gn 20:15*

10 And Lot lifted up his eyes, and beheld all the plain of Jordan, that it *was* well watered every where, before the LORD destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah, *even* as the garden of the LORD, like the land of Egypt, as thou comest unto Zoar.

11 Then Lot chose him all the plain of Jordan; and Lot journeyed east: and they separated themselves the one from the other.

12 Abram dwelled in the land of Canaan, and Lot dwelled in the cities of the plain, and pitched *his* tent toward Sodom. *Gn 19:29*

13 But the men of Sodom *were* wicked and sinners before the LORD exceedingly. *Gn 18:20*

14 ¶ And the LORD said unto Abram, after that Lot was separated from him, Lift up now thine eyes, and look

from the place where thou art northward, and southward, and eastward, and westward:

15 For all the land which thou seest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed for ever.

16 And I will make thy seed as the dust of the earth: so that if a man can number the dust of the earth, *then* shall thy seed also be numbered. *Gn* 28:14

17 Arise, walk through the land in the length of it and in the breadth of it; for I will give it unto thee.

18 Then Abram removed *his* tent, and came and dwelt in the ^{*b*}plain of Mamre, which *is* in Hebron, and built there an altar unto the LORD. *Gn 8:20; 14:13*

The wars of the kings

14 And it came to pass in the days of Amraphel king of Shinar, Arioch king of Ellasar, Chedorlaomer king of Elam, and Tidal king of nations; *Gn* 11:2

2 *That these* made war with Bera king of Sodom, and with Birsha king of Gomorrah, Shinab king of Admah, and Shemeber king of Zeboiim, and the king of Bela, which is Zoar. *Gn* 10:19

3 All these were joined together in the vale of Siddim, which is the salt sea.

4 Twelve years they served Chedorlaomer, and in the thirteenth year they rebelled.

5 And in the fourteenth year came Chedorlaomer, and the kings that *were* with him, and smote the Rephaims in Ashteroth Karnaim, and the Zuzims in Ham, and the Emims in ^aShaveh Kiriathaim, Gn 15:20

6 And the Horites in their mount Seir, unto ^bEl-paran, which *is* by the wilderness. *Gn 21:21; Dt 2:12, 22*

7 And they returned, and came to En-mishpat, which *is* Kadesh, and smote all the country of the Amalekites, and also the Amorites, that dwelt in Hazezon-tamar. *Gn* 16:14

8 And there went out the king of Sodom, and the king of Gomorrah, and the king of Admah, and the king of Zeboiim, and the king of Bela (the same *is* Zoar;) and they joined battle with them in the vale of Siddim; *Gn* 13:10

9 With Chedorlaomer the king of Elam, and with Tidal king of nations, and Amraphel king of Shinar, and Arioch king of Ellasar; four kings with five.

10 And the vale of Siddim *was full of* slimepits; and the kings of Sodom and Gomorrah fled, and fell there; and they that remained fled to the mountain.

11 And they took all the goods of Sodom and Gomorrah, and all their victuals, and went their way. *Gn* 14:16

12 And they took Lot, Abram's brother's son, who dwelt in Sodom, and his goods, and departed.

13 ¶ And there came one that had escaped, and told Abram the Hebrew; for he dwelt in the plain of Mamre the Amorite, brother of Eshcol, and brother of Aner: and these *were* confederate with Abram. *Gn* 13:18; 14:24; 40:15

14 And when Abram heard that his brother was taken captive, he ^c armed his ^d trained *servants*, born in his own house, three hundred and eighteen, and pursued *them* unto Dan. *Gn* 15:3

15 And he divided himself against them, he and his servants, by night, and smote them, and pursued them unto Hobah, which *is* on the left hand of Damascus.

16 And he brought back all the goods, and also brought again his brother Lot, and his goods, and the women also, and the people. *Gn* 14:11-12

Melchizedek blesses Abram

17 ¶ And the king of Sodom went out to meet him after his return from the slaughter of Chedorlaomer, and of the kings that *were* with him, at the valley of Shaveh, which *is* the king's dale. 2 Sm 18:18

18 And Melchizedek king of Salem brought forth bread and wine: and he *was* the priest of the most high God.

19 And he blessed him, and said, Blessed *be* Abram of the most high God, possessor of heaven and earth:

20 And blessed be the most high God, which hath delivered thine enemies into thy hand. And he gave him tithes of all.

21 And the king of Sodom said unto Abram, Give me the ^{*e*} persons, and take the goods to thyself.

22 And Abram said to the king of Sodom, I have lift up mine hand unto

the LORD, the most high God, the possessor of heaven and earth, *Ex 6:8*

23 That I will not *take* from a thread even to a shoelatchet, and that I will not take any thing that *is* thine, lest thou shouldest say, I have made Abram rich:

24 Save only that which the young men have eaten, and the portion of the men which went with me, Aner, Eshcol, and Mamre; let them take their portion.

The covenant with Abram

15 After these things the word of the LORD came unto Abram in a vision, saying, Fear not, Abram: I *am* thy shield, *and* thy exceeding great reward.

2 And Abram said, Lord GOD, what wilt thou give me, seeing I go childless, and the steward of my house *is* this Eliezer of Damascus? Acts 7.5

3 And Abram said, Behold, to me thou hast given no seed: and, lo, one born in my house is mine heir. *Gn* 14:14

4 And, behold, the word of the LORD *came* unto him, saying, This shall not be thine heir; but he that shall come forth out of thine own bowels shall be thine heir.

5 And he brought him forth abroad, and said, Look now toward heaven, and tell the stars, if thou be able to number them: and he said unto him, So shall thy seed be. *Gn* 22:17; *Ex* 32:13; *Dt* 1:10

6 And he believed in the LORD; and he counted it to him for righteousness.

7 ¶ And he said unto him, I *am* the LORD that brought thee out of Ur of the Chaldees, to give thee this land to inherit it. $G_n 12:1$

8 And he said, Lord GOD, whereby shall I know that I shall inherit it?*Lk* 1:18

9 And he said unto him, Take me an heifer of three years old, and a she goat of three years old, and a ram of three years old, and a turtledove, and a young pigeon.

10 And he took unto him all these, and divided them in the midst, and laid each piece one against another: but the birds divided he not. Ly 1:17

11 And when the fowls came down upon the carcases, Abram drove them away.

12 And when the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram; and, lo, an horror of great darkness fell upon him.

13 And he said unto Abram, Know of a surety that thy seed shall be a stranger in a land *that is* not theirs, and shall serve them; and they shall afflict them four hundred years; $G_{al} 3:17$

14 And also that nation, whom they shall serve, will I judge: and afterward shall they come out with great substance.

15 And thou shalt go to thy fathers in peace; thou shalt be buried in a good old age. *Jb 5:26*

16 But in the fourth generation they shall come hither again: for the iniquity of the Amorites *is* not yet full.

17 And it came to pass, that, when the sun went down, and it was dark,

The Second Book of Moses, Called Exodus

Israel's growth and bondage

Now these *are* the names of the children of Israel, which came into Egypt; every man and his household came with Jacob. *Gn 46:8-26*

2 Reuben, Simeon, Levi, and Judah,

3 Issachar, Zebulun, and Benjamin,

4 Dan, and Naphtali, Gad, and Asher.

5 And all the souls that came out of the ^aloins of Jacob were seventy souls: for Joseph was in Egypt *already*. *Gn* 46:26-27

6 And Joseph died, and all his brethren, and all that generation. *Gn* 50:26

7 And the children of Israel were fruitful, and increased abundantly, and multiplied, and waxed exceeding mighty; and the land was filled with them. *Gn 12:2*

8¶ Now there arose up a new king over Egypt, which knew not Joseph.

9 And he said unto his people, Behold, the people of the children of Israel *are* more and mightier than we:

10 Come on, let us deal wisely with them; lest they multiply, and it come to pass, that, when there falleth out any war, they join also unto our enemies, and fight against us, and *so* get them up out of the land. *Ps 83:3-4; 105:25; Acts 7:19*

11 Therefore they did set over them taskmasters to afflict them with their burdens. And they built for Pharaoh treasure cities, Pithom and Raamses.

12 ^{*b*} But the more they afflicted them, the more they multiplied and grew.

And they were grieved because of the children of Israel.

13 And the Egyptians made the children of Israel to serve with rigour:

14 And they made their lives bitter with hard bondage, in morter, and in brick, and in all manner of service in the field: all their service, wherein they made them serve, *was* with rigour. *Ex 2:23; 6:9*

15 ¶ And the king of Egypt spake to the Hebrew midwives, of which the name of the one *was* Shiphrah, and the name of the other Puah:

16 And he said, When ye do the office of a midwife to the Hebrew women, and see *them* upon the stools; if it *be* a son, then ye shall kill him: but if it *be* a daughter, then she shall live.

17 But the midwives feared God, and did not as the king of Egypt commanded them, but saved the men children alive.

18 And the king of Egypt called for the midwives, and said unto them, Why have ye done this thing, and have saved the men children alive?

19 And the midwives said unto Pharaoh, Because the Hebrew women *are* not as the Egyptian women; for they *are* lively, and are delivered ere the midwives come in unto them.

^{1:5} *a* Heb. thigh **1:12** *b* Heb. And as they afflicted them, so they multiplied, etc.

20 Therefore God dealt well with the midwives: and the people multiplied, and waxed very mighty. *Ex 1:12*

21 And it came to pass, because the midwives feared God, that he made them houses. *1 Sm 2:35; 1 Kgs 2:24; 11:38*

22 And Pharaoh charged all his people, saying, Every son that is born ye shall cast into the river, and every daughter ye shall save alive. *Acts 7:19*

Moses' birth

2 And there went a man of the house of Levi, and took *to wife* a daughter of Levi. Nm 26:59

2 And the woman conceived, and bare a son: and when she saw him that he *was a* goodly *child*, she hid him three months. Acts 7:20; Heb 11:23

3 And when she could not longer hide him, she took for him an ark of bulrushes, and daubed it with slime and with pitch, and put the child therein; and she laid *it* in the flags by the river's brink.

4 And his sister stood afar off, to wit what would be done to him. *Ex 15:20*

5¶ And the daughter of Pharaoh came down to wash *herself* at the river; and her maidens walked along by the river's side; and when she saw the ark among the flags, she sent her maid to fetch it.

6 And when she had opened *it*, she saw the child: and, behold, the babe wept. And she had compassion on him, and said, This *is one* of the Hebrews' children.

7 Then said his sister to Pharaoh's daughter, Shall I go and call to thee a nurse of the Hebrew women, that she may nurse the child for thee?

8 And Pharaoh's daughter said to her, Go. And the maid went and called the child's mother.

9 And Pharaoh's daughter said unto her, Take this child away, and nurse it for me, and I will give *thee* thy wages. And the woman took the child, and nursed it.

10 And the child grew, and she brought him unto Pharaoh's daughter, and he became her son. And she called his name ^a Moses: and she said, Because I drew him out of the water.

Moses flees to Midian

11 ¶ And it came to pass in those days, when Moses was grown, that he went out unto his brethren, and looked on their burdens: and he spied an Egyptian smiting an Hebrew, one of his brethren.

12 And he looked this way and that way, and when he saw that *there was* no man, he slew the Egyptian, and hid him in the sand.

13 And when he went out the second day, behold, two men of the Hebrews strove together: and he said to him that did the wrong, Wherefore smitest thou thy fellow?

14 And he said, Who made thee ^ba prince and a judge over us? intendest thou to kill me, as thou killedst

the Egyptian? And Moses feared, and said, Surely this thing is known. *Gn* 19:9

15 Now when Pharaoh heard this thing, he sought to slay Moses. But Moses fled from the face of Pharaoh, and dwelt in the land of Midian: and he sat down by a well. *Gn 24:11; Acts 7:29*

16 Now the ^apriest of Midian had seven daughters: and they came and drew *water*, and filled the troughs to water their father's flock. *Gn 24:11; Ex 3:1*

17 And the shepherds came and drove them away: but Moses stood up and helped them, and watered their flock.

18 And when they came to Reuel their father, he said, How *is it that* ye are come so soon to day?

19 And they said, An Égyptian delivered us out of the hand of the shepherds, and also drew *water* enough for us, and watered the flock.

20 And he said unto his daughters, And where *is* he? why *is* it *that* ye have left the man? call him, that he may eat bread. *Gn 31:54*

21 And Moses was content to dwell with the man: and he gave Moses Zipporah his daughter.

22 And she bare *him* a son, and he called his name ^bGershom: for he said, I have been a stranger in a strange land.

23 ¶ And it came to pass in process of time, that the king of Egypt died: and the children of Israel sighed by reason of the bondage, and they cried, and their cry came up unto God by reason of the bondage. *Gn 18:20-21; Acts 7:30; Jas 5:4*

24 And God heard their groaning, and God remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob.

25 And God looked upon the children of Israel, and God ^chad respect unto *them.* Ex 4:31; Lk 1:25

Moses and the burning bush

3 Now Moses kept the flock of Jethro his father in law, the priest of Midian: and he led the flock to the backside of the desert, and came to the mountain of God, *even* to Horeb. *Ex 17:6; Nm 10:29*

2 And the angel of the LORD appeared unto him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush: and he looked, and, behold, the bush burned with fire, and the bush *was* not consumed. *Dt 33:16*

3 And Moses said, I will now turn aside, and see this great sight, why the bush is not burnt. Acts 7:31

4 And when the LORD saw that he turned aside to see, God called unto him out of the midst of the bush, and said, Moses, Moses. And he said, Here *am* I.

5 And he said, Draw not nigh hither: put off thy shoes from off thy feet, for the place whereon thou standest *is* holy ground. *Ex 19:12; Jo 5:15; Acts 7:33*

6 Moreover he said, I *am* the God of thy father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. And Moses hid his face; for he was afraid to look upon God. *Ex 4:5; Mt 22:32*

7 ¶ And the LORD said, I have surely seen the affliction of my people which *are* in Egypt, and have heard their cry by reason of their taskmasters; for I know their sorrows; *Ps 106:44*

8 And I am come down to deliver them out of the hand of the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land unto a good land and a large, unto a land flowing with milk and honey; unto the place of the Canaanites, and the Hittites, and the Amorites, and the Perizzites, and the Hivites, and the Jebusites. *Gn 50:24; Ex 13:5*

9 Now therefore, behold, the cry of the children of Israel is come unto me: and I have also seen the oppression wherewith the Egyptians oppress them.

10 Come now therefore, and I will send thee unto Pharaoh, that thou mayest bring forth my people the children of Israel out of Egypt. *Ps 105:26; Mi 6:4*

11 And Moses said unto God, Who *am* I, that I should go unto Pharaoh, and that I should bring forth the children of Israel out of Egypt? *Ex 6:12*

12 And he said, Certainly I will be with thee; and this *shall be* a token unto thee, that I have sent thee: When thou hast brought forth the people out of Egypt, ye shall serve God upon this mountain.

13 ¶ And Moses said unto God, Behold, *when* I come unto the children of Israel, and shall say unto them, The God of your fathers hath sent me unto you; and they shall say

to me, What *is* his name? what shall I say unto them?

14 And God said unto Moses, I AM THAT I AM: and he said, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, I AM hath sent me unto you. *Ex 6:3; Jn 8:58*

15 And God said moreover unto Moses, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, The LORD God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, hath sent me unto you: this *is* my name for ever, and this *is* my memorial unto all generations. *Ex 3:6*

16 Go, and gather the elders of Israel together, and say unto them, The LORD God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, of Isaac, and of Jacob, appeared unto me, saying, I have surely visited you, and *seen* that which is done to you in Egypt:

17 And I have said, I will bring you up out of the affliction of Egypt unto the land of the Canaanites, and the Hittites, and the Amorites, and the Perizzites, and the Hivites, and the Jebusites, unto a land flowing with milk and honey. *Gn 15:13-21*

18 And they shall hearken to thy voice: and thou shalt come, thou and the elders of Israel, unto the king of Egypt, and ye shall say unto him, The LORD God of the Hebrews hath met with us: and now let us go, we beseech thee, three days' journey into the wilderness, that we may sacrifice to the LORD our God. *Ex 7:16*

19 \P And I am sure that the king of Egypt will not let you go, ano, not by a mighty hand. Ex 5:2; 6:1

20 And I will stretch out my hand, and smite Egypt with all my wonders which I will do in the midst thereof: and after that he will let you go. *Dt 6:22*

21 And I will give this people favour in the sight of the Egyptians: and it shall come to pass, that, when ye go, ye shall not go empty: *Ex 11:3; 12:36; Ps 106:46*

22 But every woman shall borrow of her neighbour, and of her that sojourneth in her house, jewels of silver, and jewels of gold, and raiment: and ye shall put *them* upon your sons, and upon your daughters; and ye shall spoil ^b the Egyptians. *Gn* 15:14; *Ex* 11:2; *Ez* 39:10

God equips Moses

4 And Moses answered and said, But, behold, they will not believe me, nor hearken unto my voice: for they will say, The LORD hath not appeared unto thee.

2 And the LORD said unto him, What *is* that in thine hand? And he said, A rod.

3 And he said, Cast it on the ground. And he cast it on the ground, and it became a serpent; and Moses fled from before it.

4 And the LORD said unto Moses, Put forth thine hand, and take it by the tail. And he put forth his hand, and caught it, and it became a rod in his hand:

5 That they may believe that the LORD God of their fathers, the God of

Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, hath appeared unto thee.

6 ¶ And the LORD said furthermore unto him, Put now thine hand into thy bosom. And he put his hand into his bosom: and when he took it out, behold, his hand *was* leprous as snow.

7 And he said, Put thine hand into thy bosom again. And he put his hand into his bosom again; and plucked it out of his bosom, and, behold, it was turned again as his *other* flesh. 2Kgs 5:14

8 And it shall come to pass, if they will not believe thee, neither hearken to the voice of the first sign, that they will believe the voice of the latter sign.

9 And it shall come to pass, if they will not believe also these two signs, neither hearken unto thy voice, that thou shalt take of the water of the river, and pour *it* upon the dry *land:* and the water which thou takest out of the river ^c shall become blood upon the dry *land.*

10 ¶ Ánd Moses said unto the LORD, O my Lord, I *am* not ^{*d*}eloquent, neither ^{*e*}heretofore, nor since thou hast spoken unto thy servant: but I *am* slow of speech, and of a slow tongue. Ex 4:1; 6:12

11 And the LORD said unto him, Who hath made man's mouth? or who maketh the dumb, or deaf, or the seeing, or the blind? have not I the LORD? *Ps 94:9*

3:19 *a* Or, but by strong hand **3:22** *b* Or, Egypt **4:9** *c* Heb. shall be and shall be **4:10** dHeb. *a* man of words *e* Heb. since yesterday, nor since the third day **12** Now therefore go, and I will be with thy mouth, and teach thee what thou shalt say. *Is 50:4; Jer 1:9; Mt 10:19-20*

13 And he said, O my Lord, send, I pray thee, by the hand *of him whom* thou ^a wilt send.

14 And the anger of the LORD was kindled against Moses, and he said, *Is* not Aaron the Levite thy brother? I know that he can speak well. And also, behold, he cometh forth to meet thee: and when he seeth thee, he will be glad in his heart.

15 And thou shalt speak unto him, and put words in his mouth: and I will be with thy mouth, and with his mouth, and will teach you what ye shall do.

16 And he shall be thy spokesman unto the people: and he shall be, *even* he shall be to thee instead of a mouth, and thou shalt be to him instead of God.

17 And thou shalt take this rod in thine hand, wherewith thou shalt do signs.

Moses returns to Egypt

18 ¶ And Moses went and returned to ^{*b*}Jethro his father in law, and said unto him, Let me go, I pray thee, and return unto my brethren which *are* in Egypt, and see whether they be yet alive. And Jethro said to Moses, Go in peace. Ex 3.1

19 And the LORD said unto Moses in Midian, Go, return into Egypt: for all the men are dead which sought thy life.

20 And Moses took his wife and his sons, and set them upon an ass, and he returned to the land of Egypt: and Moses took the rod of God in his hand. Ex 4:17

21 And the LORD said unto Moses, When thou goest to return into Egypt, see that thou do all those wonders before Pharaoh, which I have put in thine hand: but I will harden his heart, that he shall not let the people go. Ex 3:20; 7:13; 9:12

22 And thou shalt say unto Pharaoh, Thus saith the LORD, Israel *is* my son, *even* my firstborn: *Jer 31:9; Hos 11:1; Rom 9:4*

23 And I say unto thee, Let my son go, that he may serve me: and if thou refuse to let him go, behold, I will slay thy son, *even* thy firstborn. *Ex 11:5; 12:29*

24 ¶ And it came to pass by the way in the inn, that the LORD met him, and sought to kill him. *Gn* 17:14; 1 *Chr* 21:16

25 Then Zipporah took c a sharp stone, and cut off the foreskin of her son, and d cast *it* at his feet, and said, Surely a bloody husband *art* thou to me. Jo 5:2-3

26 So he let him go: then she said, A bloody husband *thou art,* because of the circumcision.

27 ¶ And the LORD said to Aaron, Go into the wilderness to meet Moses. And he went, and met him in the mount of God, and kissed him. Ex 3:1

28 And Moses told Aaron all the words of the LORD who had sent him,

and all the signs which he had commanded him. *Ex 4:8-9*

29 \P And Moses and Aaron went and gathered together all the elders of the children of Israel: Ex 3:16

30 And Aaron spake all the words which the LORD had spoken unto Moses, and did the signs in the sight of the people.

31 And the people believed: and when they heard that the LORD had visited the children of Israel, and that he had looked upon their affliction, then they bowed their heads and worshipped. Ex 2:25; 3:18

Pharaoh oppresses Israel

5 And afterward Moses and Aaron went in, and told Pharaoh, Thus saith the LORD God of Israel, Let my people go, that they may hold a feast unto me in the wilderness. $E_{X \ 10.9}$

2 And Pharaoh said, Who *is* the LORD, that I should obey his voice to let Israel go? I know not the LORD, neither will I let Israel go. *Ex 3:19; 2 Kgs 18:35*

3 And they said, The God of the Hebrews hath met with us: let us go, we pray thee, three days' journey into the desert, and sacrifice unto the LORD our God; lest he fall upon us with pestilence, or with the sword.

4 And the king of Egypt said unto them, Wherefore do ye, Moses and Aaron, let the people from their works? get you unto your burdens.

5 And Pharaoh said, Behold, the people of the land now *are* many,

and ye make them rest from their burdens.

6 And Pharaoh commanded the same day the taskmasters of the people, and their officers, saying, *Ex 5:10*

7 Ye shall no more give the people straw to make brick, as heretofore: let them go and gather straw for themselves.

8 And the tale of the bricks, which they did make heretofore, ye shall lay upon them; ye shall not diminish *ought* thereof: for they *be* idle; therefore they cry, saying, Let us go *and* sacrifice to our God.

9 ^aLet there more work be laid upon the men, that they may labour therein; and let them not regard vain words.

10 \P And the taskmasters of the people went out, and their officers, and they spake to the people, saying, Thus saith Pharaoh, I will not give you straw. *Ex 1:11*

11 Go ye, get you straw where ye can find it: yet not ought of your work shall be diminished.

12 So the people were scattered abroad throughout all the land of Egypt to gather stubble instead of straw.

13 And the taskmasters hasted *them*, saying, Fulfil your works, ^b your daily tasks, as when there was straw.

14 And the officers of the children of Israel, which Pharaoh's taskmasters had set over them, were beaten, *and* demanded, Wherefore have ye not fulfilled your task in making brick both yesterday and to day, as heretofore?

15 ¶ Then the officers of the children of Israel came and cried unto Pharaoh, saying, Wherefore dealest thou thus with thy servants?

16 There is no straw given unto thy servants, and they say to us, Make brick: and, behold, thy servants *are* beaten; but the fault *is* in thine own people.

17 But he said, Ye *are* idle, *ye are* idle: therefore ye say, Let us go *and* do sacrifice to the LORD.

18 Go therefore now, *and* work; for there shall no straw be given you, yet shall ye deliver the tale of bricks.

19 And the officers of the children of Israel did see *that* they *were* in evil *case*, after it was said, Ye shall not minish *ought* from your bricks of your daily task.

20 ¶ And they met Moses and Aaron, who stood in the way, as they came forth from Pharaoh:

21 And they said unto them, The LORD look upon you, and judge; because ye have made our savour ^ato be abhorred in the eyes of Pharaoh, and in the eyes of his servants, to put a sword in their hand to slay us. *Gn* 34:30

God's promise of deliverance

22 And Moses returned unto the LORD, and said, Lord, wherefore hast thou *so* evil entreated this people? why *is* it *that* thou hast sent me?

23 For since I came to Pharaoh to speak in thy name, he hath done evil to this people; ^bneither hast thou delivered thy people at all.

6 Then the LORD said unto Moses, Now shalt thou see what I will do to Pharaoh: for with a strong hand shall he let them go, and with a strong hand shall he drive them out of his land. Ex 3:19-20

2 And God spake unto Moses, and said unto him, I *am*^c the LORD: *Is* 42:8

3 And I appeared unto Abraham, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, by *the name of* God Almighty, but by my name JEHOVAH was I not known to them. *Ps 68:4*

4 And I have also established my covenant with them, to give them the land of Canaan, the land of their pilgrimage, wherein they were strangers. *Gn 15:18*

5 And I have also heard the groaning of the children of Israel, whom the Egyptians keep in bondage; and I have remembered my covenant. *Ex 2:24*

6 Wherefore say unto the children of Israel, I *am* the LORD, and I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, and I will rid you out of their bondage, and I will redeem you with a stretched out arm, and with great judgments: *Dt 7:8; 26:8; 1 Chr 17:21*

7 And I will take you to me for a people, and I will be to you a God: and ye shall know that I *am* the LORD your

God, which bringeth you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians.

8 And I will bring you in unto the land, concerning the which I did ^aswear to give it to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob; and I will give it you for an heritage: I *am* the LORD. *Gn* 14:22; 15:18

9 ¶ And Moses spake so unto the children of Israel: but they hearkened not unto Moses for b anguish of spirit, and for cruel bondage. *Ex 5:21*

10 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

11 Go in, speak unto Pharaoh king of Egypt, that he let the children of Israel go out of his land.

12 And Moses spake before the LORD, saying, Behold, the children of Israel have not hearkened unto me; how then shall Pharaoh hear me, who *am* of uncircumcised lips? *Ex 4:10; 6:30; Jer 1:6*

13 And the LORD spake unto Moses and unto Aaron, and gave them a charge unto the children of Israel, and unto Pharaoh king of Egypt, to bring the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt.

The descendants of Israel

14 ¶ These *be* the heads of their fathers' houses: The sons of Reuben the firstborn of Israel; Hanoch, and Pallu, Hezron, and Carmi: these *be* the families of Reuben.

15 And the sons of Simeon; Jemuel, and Jamin, and Ohad, and Jachin, and Zohar, and Shaul the son of a Canaanitish woman: these *are* the families of Simeon. *Gn 46:10; 1 Chr 4:24* **16** ¶ And these *are* the names of the sons of Levi according to their generations; Gershon, and Kohath, and Merari: and the years of the life of Levi *were* an hundred thirty and seven years. $G_{n.46:11}$

17 The sons of Gershon; Libni, and Shimi, according to their families.

18 And the sons of Kohath; Amram, and Izhar, and Hebron, and Uzziel: and the years of the life of Kohath *were* an hundred thirty and three years. *Nm 3:19*

19 And the sons of Merari; Mahali and Mushi: these *are* the families of Levi according to their generations.

20 And Amram took him Jochebed his father's sister to wife; and she bare him Aaron and Moses: and the years of the life of Amram *were* an hundred and thirty and seven years.

21 ¶ And the sons of Izhar; Korah, and Nepheg, and Zichri. *Nm* 16:1

22 And the sons of Uzziel; Mishael, and Elzaphan, and Zithri. Lv 10:4; Nm 3:30

23 And Aaron took him Elisheba, daughter of Amminadab, sister of Naashon, to wife; and she bare him Nadab, and Abihu, Eleazar, and Ithamar.

24 And the sons of Korah; Assir, and Elkanah, and Abiasaph: these *are* the families of the Korhites. *1 Chr 6:22-23*

25 And Eleazar Aaron's son took him *one* of the daughters of Putiel to wife; and she bare him Phinehas: these *are*

the heads of the fathers of the Levites according to their families. Nm 25:7-13

26 These *are* that Aaron and Moses, to whom the LORD said, Bring out the children of Israel from the land of Egypt according to their armies. *Ex 7.4*

27 These *are* they which spake to Pharaoh king of Egypt, to bring out the children of Israel from Egypt: these *are* that Moses and Aaron.

Aaron to speak for Moses

28 ¶ And it came to pass on the day *when* the LORD spake unto Moses in the land of Egypt,

29 That the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, I *am* the LORD: speak thou unto Pharaoh king of Egypt all that I say unto thee. *Ex 6:2, 11; 7:2*

30 And Moses said before the LORD, Behold, I *am* of uncircumcised lips, and how shall Pharaoh hearken unto me?

7 And the LORD said unto Moses, See, I have made thee a god to Pharaoh: and Aaron thy brother shall be thy prophet.

2 Thoushalt speak all that I command thee: and Aaron thy brother shall speak unto Pharaoh, that he send the children of Israel out of his land. Ex 4:15

3 And I will harden Pharaoh's heart, and multiply my signs and my wonders in the land of Egypt. *Ex 4:21; 11:9*

4 But Pharaoh shall not hearken unto you, that I may lay my hand upon Egypt, and bring forth mine armies, *and* my people the children of Israel, out of the land of Egypt by great judgments.

5 And the Egyptians shall know that I *am* the LORD, when I stretch forth mine hand upon Egypt, and bring out the children of Israel from among them. E_{X320}

6 And Moses and Aaron did as the LORD commanded them, so did they.

7 And Moses *was* fourscore years old, and Aaron fourscore and three years old, when they spake unto Pharaoh. *Dt 31:2*

The rod becomes a serpent

8 ¶ And the LORD spake unto Moses and unto Aaron, saying,

9 When Pharaoh shall speak unto you, saying, Shew a miracle for you: then thou shalt say unto Aaron, Take thy rod, and cast *it* before Pharaoh, *and* it shall become a serpent. *Ex 4:2*

10 And Moses and Aaron went in unto Pharaoh, and they did so as the LORD had commanded: and Aaron cast down his rod before Pharaoh, and before his servants, and it became a serpent.

11 Then Pharaoh also called the wise men and the sorcerers: now the magicians of Egypt, they also did in like manner with their enchantments.

12 For they cast down every man his rod, and they became serpents: but Aaron's rod swallowed up their rods.

13 And he hardened Pharaoh's heart, that he hearkened not unto them; as the LORD had said. *Ex 4:21*

The water becomes blood

14 \P And the LORD said unto Moses, Pharaoh's heart *is* hardened, he refuse th to let the people go. *Ex 8:15*

15 Get thee unto Pharaoh in the morning; lo, he goeth out unto the water; and thou shalt stand by the river's brink against he come; and the rod which was turned to a serpent shalt thou take in thine hand. *Ex 8:20*

16 And thou shalt say unto him, The LORD God of the Hebrews hath sent me unto thee, saying, Let my people go, that they may serve me in the wilderness: and, behold, hitherto thou wouldest not hear. Ex 3:12, 18: 9:1

17 Thus saith the LORD, In this thou shalt know that I *am* the LORD: behold, I will smite with the rod that *is* in mine hand upon the waters which *are* in the river, and they shall be turned to blood.

18 And the fish that *is* in the river shall die, and the river shall stink; and the Egyptians shall lothe to drink of the water of the river. $E_{X,7,21,24}$

19 ¶ And the LORD spake unto Moses, Say unto Aaron, Take thy rod, and stretch out thine hand upon the waters of Egypt, upon their streams, upon their rivers, and upon their ponds, and upon all their ^apools of water, that they may become blood; and *that* there may be blood throughout all the land of Egypt, both in *vessels of* wood, and in *vessels of* stone.

20 And Moses and Aaron did so, as the LORD commanded; and he lifted up the rod, and smote the waters

that *were* in the river, in the sight of Pharaoh, and in the sight of his servants; and all the waters that *were* in the river were turned to blood. *Ps* 78:44

21 And the fish that *was* in the river died; and the river stank, and the Egyptians could not drink of the water of the river; and there was blood throughout all the land of Egypt. *Ex 7:18*

22 And the magicians of Egypt did so with their enchantments: and Pharaoh's heart was hardened, neither did he hearken unto them; as the LORD had said.

23 And Pharaoh turned and went into his house, neither did he set his heart to this also.

24 And all the Egyptians digged round about the river for water to drink; for they could not drink of the water of the river.


25 And seven days were fulfilled, after that the LORD had smitten the river.

The plague of frogs

8 And the LORD spake unto Moses, Go unto Pharaoh, and say unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Let my people go, that they may serve me. $E_{X3:12, 18; 5:1}$

2 And if thou refuse to let *them* go, behold, I will smite all thy borders with frogs: Ex 7:14

3 And the river shall bring forth frogs abundantly, which shall go up and come into thine house, and into thy bedchamber, and upon thy bed, and into the house of thy servants, and



The Gospel According to St. Matthew

The genealogy of Jesus

1 The book of the generation of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham. *Gn 22:18; Is 11:1; Rom 1:3*

2 Abraham begat Isaac; and Isaac begat Jacob; and Jacob begat Judas and his brethren; *Gn* 25:26

3 And Judas begat Phares and Zara of Thamar; and Phares begat Esrom; and Esrom begat Aram; *Gn* 46:12

4 And Aram begat Aminadab; and Aminadab begat Naasson; and Naasson begat Salmon;

5 And Salmon begat Booz of Rachab; and Booz begat Obed of Ruth; and Obed begat Jesse; *Heb* 11:31

6 And Jesse begat David the king; and David the king begat Solomon of her *that had been the wife* of Urias;

7 And Solomon begat Roboam; and Roboam begat Abia; and Abia begat Asa;

8 And Asa begat Josaphat; and Josaphat begat Joram; and Joram begat Ozias;

9 And Ozias begat Joatham; and Joatham begat Achaz; and Achaz begat Ezekias;

10 And Ezekias begat Manasses; and Manasses begat Amon; and Amon begat Josias;

11 And ^aJosias begat Jechonias and his brethren, about the time they were carried away to Babylon: *Jer 27:20*

12 And after they were brought to Babylon, Jechonias begat Salathiel; and Salathiel begat Zorobabel; *1 Chr 3:17*

13 And Zorobabel begat Abiud; and Abiud begat Eliakim; and Eliakim begat Azor;

14 And Azor begat Sadoc; and Sadoc begat Achim; and Achim begat Eliud;

15 And Eliud begat Eleazar; and Eleazar begat Matthan; and Matthan begat Jacob;

16 And Jacob begat Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom was born Jesus, who is called Christ. *Mt 27:17*

17 So all the generations from Abraham to David *are* fourteen generations; and from David until the carrying away into Babylon *are* fourteen generations; and from the carrying away into Babylon unto Christ *are* fourteen generations.

The birth of Jesus

18 ¶ Now the birth of Jesus Christ was on this wise: When as his mother Mary was espoused to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Ghost. *Gn 3:15*

19 Then Joseph her husband, being a just *man*, and not willing to make her a publick example, was minded to put her away privily. *Dt 22:21-24*

20 But while he thought on these things, behold, the angel of the Lord

appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is ^aconceived in her is of the Holy Ghost.

21 And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name ^{*b*}JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins.

22 Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying,

23 Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and ^c they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us.

24 Then Joseph being raised from sleep did as the angel of the Lord had bidden him, and took unto him his wife:

25 And knew her not till she had brought forth her firstborn son: and he called his name JESUS. *Mt 1:21*

The coming of the wise men

2Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judæa in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem,

2 Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him.

3 When Herod the king had heard *these things,* he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him.

4 And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people

together, he demanded of them where Christ should be born.

5 And they said unto him, In Bethlehem of Judæa: for thus it is written by the prophet, *Gn 35:19*

6 And thou Bethlehem, *in* the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come a Governor, that shall ^drule my people Israel.

7 Then Herod, when he had privily called the wise men, enquired of them diligently what time the star appeared.

8 And he sent them to Bethlehem, and said, Go and search diligently for the young child; and when ye have found *him*, bring me word again, that I may come and worship him also.

9 When they had heard the king, they departed; and, lo, the star, which they saw in the east, went before them, till it came and stood over where the young child was.

10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceeding great joy.

11 ¶ And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him: and when they had opened their treasures, they e presented unto him gifts; gold, and frank-incense, and myrrh. *Ps 72:10*

12 And being warned of God in a dream that they should not return to

Herod, they departed into their own country another way. Mt 1:20; 2:22; 27:19

The flight into Egypt

13 And when they were departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeareth to Joseph in a dream, saying, Arise, and take the young child and his mother, and flee into Egypt, and be thou there until I bring thee word: for Herod will seek the young child to destroy him. *Acts 5:19*

14 When he arose, he took the young child and his mother by night, and departed into Egypt:

15 And was there until the death of Herod: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, Out of Egypt have I called my son.

16 ¶ Then Herod, when he saw that he was mocked of the wise men, was exceeding wroth, and sent forth, and slew all the children that were in Bethlehem, and in all the coasts thereof, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had diligently enquired of the wise men. Is 59:7

17 Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremy the prophet, saying,

18 In Rama was there a voice heard, lamentation, and weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping *for* her children, and would not be comforted, because they are not. *Gn* 42:36

From Egypt to Nazareth

19 ¶ But when Herod was dead, behold, an angel of the Lord appeareth in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, *Mt 1:20*

20 Saying, Arise, and take the young child and his mother, and go into the land of Israel: for they are dead which sought the young child's life. *Ex 4:19*

21 And he arose, and took the young child and his mother, and came into the land of Israel.

22 But when he heard that Archelaus did reign in Judæa in the room of his father Herod, he was afraid to go thither: notwithstanding, being warned of God in a dream, he turned aside into the parts of Galilee: *Lk 2:39*

23 And he came and dwelt in a city called Nazareth: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets, He shall be called a Nazarene.

John the Baptist

3 In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judæa,

2 And saying, Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. *Dn 2:44*

3 For this is he that was spoken of by the prophet Esaias, saying, The voice of one crying in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. *Is 40:3; Lk 1:76; Jn 1:23*

4 Ånd the same John had his raiment of camel's hair, and a leathern girdle about his loins; and his meat was locusts and wild honey. Lv 11:22; 2 Kgs 1:8

5 Then went out to him Jerusalem, and all Judæa, and all the region round about Jordan, *Mk* 1:5 **6** And were baptized of him in Jordan, confessing their sins. *Mt 3:11, 13-16*

7¶ But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees come to his baptism, he said unto them, O generation of vipers, who hath warned you to flee from the wrath to come? *Mt* 12:34

8 Bring forth therefore fruits ^ameet for repentance: *Jer 36:3; Lk 3:8; Acts 26:20*

9 And think not to say within yourselves, We have Abraham to *our* father: for I say unto you, that God is able of these stones to raise up children unto Abraham.

10 And now also the axe is laid unto the root of the trees: therefore every tree which bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire.

11 I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and *with* fire:

12 Whose fan *is* in his hand, and he will throughly purge his floor, and gather his wheat into the garner; but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire.

The baptism of Jesus

13 ¶ Then cometh Jesus from Galilee to Jordan unto John, to be baptized of him.

14 But John forbad him, saying, I have need to be baptized of thee, and comest thou to me?

15 And Jesus answering said unto him, Suffer *it to be so* now: for thus it becometh us to fulfil all righteousness. Then he suffered him. *Ps* 40:7-8

16 And Jesus, when he was baptized, went up straightway out of the water: and, lo, the heavens were opened unto him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove, and lighting upon him: *Is 11:2*

17 And lo a voice from heaven, saying, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. *Ps 2:7; Is 42:1*

The temptation in the wilderness

4 Then was Jesus led up of the spirit into the wilderness to be tempted of the devil. *Lk* 4:1-13

2 And when he had fasted forty days and forty nights, he was afterward an hungred. *Ex 34:28; Dt 9:9; 1 Kgs 19:8*

3 And when the tempter came to him, he said, If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread.

4 But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.

5 Then the devil taketh him up into the holy city, and setteth him on a pinnacle of the temple, *Neh 11:1; Is 48:2*

6 And saith unto him, If thou be the Son of God, cast thyself down: for it is written, He shall give his angels charge concerning thee: and in *their* hands they shall bear thee up, lest at

any time thou dash thy foot against a stone. *Ps 91:11-12*

7 Jesus said unto him, It is written again, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God. Dt 6:16; Mt 4:4, 10

8 Again, the devil taketh him up into an exceeding high mountain, and sheweth him all the kingdoms of the world, and the glory of them; *Mt 16:26*

9 And saith unto him, All these things will I give thee, if thou wilt fall down and worship me.

10 Then saith Jesus unto him, Get thee hence, Satan: for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve. *1 Chr 21:1*

11 Then the devil leaveth him, and, behold, angels came and ministered unto him. *Mt 26:53; Lk 22:43; Heb 1:14*

The beginning of Jesus' ministry

12 ¶ Now when Jesus had heard that John was ^a cast into prison, he departed into Galilee; *Mk* 1:14; *Lk* 3:20; 4:14

13 And leaving Nazareth, he came and dwelt in Capernaum, which is upon the sea coast, in the borders of Zabulon and Nephthalim: *Mk 1:21*

14 That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying,

15 The land of Zabulon, and the land of Nephthalim, *by* the way of the sea, beyond Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles;

16 The people which sat in darkness saw great light; and to them which sat in the region and shadow of death light is sprung up.

17 ¶ From that time Jesus began to preach, and to say, Repent: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. *Mk* 1:14-15

Jesus calls four disciples

18 ¶ And Jesus, walking by the sea of Galilee, saw two brethren, Simon called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea: for they were fishers.

19 And he saith unto them, Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men.

20 And they straightway left *their* nets, and followed him.

21 And going on from thence, he saw other two brethren, James *the son* of Zebedee, and John his brother, in a ship with Zebedee their father, mending their nets; and he called them. *Mt 10:2*

22 And they immediately left the ship and their father, and followed him.

23 ¶ And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all manner of sickness and all manner of disease among the people.

24 And his fame went throughout all Syria: and they brought unto him all sick people that were taken with divers diseases and torments, and those which were possessed with devils, and those which were lunatick, and those that had the palsy; and he healed them.

4:12 a Or, delivered up

25 And there followed him great multitudes of people from Galilee, and from Decapolis, and from Jerusalem, and from Judæa, and from beyond Iordan. I k 6.17

The Beatitudes

5 And seeing the multitudes, he went up into a mountain: and when he was set, his disciples came unto him:

2 And he opened his mouth, and taught them, saying, Mt 13:35

- **3** Blessed *are* the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- 4 Blessed *are* they that mourn: for they shall be comforted.
- **5** Blessed *are* the meek: for they shall inherit the earth. Ps 37:11
- 6 Blessed *are* they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled. Jn 4:14
- **7** Blessed *are* the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy. 2 Sm 22:26
- 8 Blessed *are* the pure in heart: for they shall see God. Acts 15:9
- **9** Blessed *are* the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God. Mt 5:45
- **10** Blessed *are* they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Mt 5:3
- 11 Blessed are ye, when *men* shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you a falsely, for my sake.
- 12 Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great *is* your reward in

heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before vou. Lk 6:23: Acts 5:41: 1 Thes 2:15

Teaching about salt and light

13 ¶ Ye are the salt of the earth: but if the salt have lost his savour, wherewith shall it be salted? it is thenceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out, and to be trodden under foot of men. Lv 2:13

14 Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid. Jn 8:12

15 Neither do men light a candle, and put it under ^ba bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house. Mk 4:21

16 Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.

The higher righteousness

17 Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfil.

18 For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled. Lk 16:17

19 Whosoever therefore shall break one of these least commandments. and shall teach men so, he shall be called the least in the kingdom of heaven: but whosoever shall do and

teach *them*, the same shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven.*Mt*11:11

20 For I say unto you, That except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven. Phil 3:9

Anger and reconciliation

21 ¶ Ye have heard that it was said ^a by them of old time, Thou shalt not kill: and whosoever shall kill shall be in danger of the judgment: Ex 20:13; Dt 5:17

22 But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, ^bRaca, shall be in danger of the council: but whosoever shall say, Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire. Mt 10:28

23 Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee;

24 Leave there thy gift before the altar, and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift.

25 Agree with thine adversarv quickly, whiles thou art in the way with him; lest at any time the adversary deliver thee to the judge, and the judge deliver thee to the officer, and thou be cast into prison.

26 Verily I say unto thee, Thou shalt by no means come out thence, till thou hast paid the uttermost farthing.

Adultery and divorce

46 For if ye love them which love you, what reward have ye? do not even the publicans the same?

47 And if ye salute your brethren only, what do ye more *than others?* do not even the publicans so? *Mt 5:20*

48 Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect.

Piety and almsgiving

A

Aaron The brother of Moses. He spoke on behalf of Moses before Pharaoh (Ex 4:14–16, 27–31; 7:1–2). He was Israel's first high priest (Ex 28:1; Nm 17; Heb 5:1–4).

Abba "Father" in Aramaic, one of the languages Jesus spoke. It can be an intimate term like "Daddy."

Rom 8:15 whereby we cry, **A**, Father. Gal 4:6 your hearts, crying, **A**, Father.

Abed-nego A friend of the prophet Daniel. He was deported from Israel to Babylon with Daniel (Dn 1:1–6). His name was changed from Azariah (Dn 1:7). He refused to worship an idol (Dn 3:1–12) and was saved from the furnace (Dn 3:13–30).

Abel Second son of Adam (Gn 4:2). Offered acceptable sacrifice to God (Gn 4:4; Heb 11:4). Murdered by Cain (Gn 4:8; Mt 23:35; Lk 11:51; 1 Jn 3:12).

abhor To despise, or hate.

Ps 119:163 I hate and **a** lying: Prv 24:24 nations shall **a** him: Rom 12:9 **A** that which is evil;

Abiathar A priest during King David's lifetime (1 Sm 23:6).

Abner A commander of the Israelite army, led by Saul (1 Sm 14:50; 17:55; 26:5). Abner was murdered by Joab (2 Sm 3:27).

abominable Detestable; loathsome.

Dt 14:3 Thou shalt not eat any **a** thing.

abomination Something that is awful and repulsive, such as wickedness (Prv 8:7), in the sight of God (Lk 16:15).

Abraham; Abram Abram was son of Terah (Gn 11:26–27) and husband of Sarah (Gn 11:29). God declared him righteous by faith (Gn 15:6; Rom 4:3; Gal 3:6–9). God changed his name to Abraham (Gn 17:5; Neh 9:7). He is called the servant of God (Gn 26:24), friend of God (2 Chr 20:7; Is 41:8; Jas 2:23), prophet (Gn 20:7), and father of the Israelite people (Ex 3:15; Is 51:2; Mt 3:9; Jn 8:39–58).

Absalom He was a son of David and Maacah (2 Sm 3:3). He conspired to overthrow his father and become the king; he was killed by Joab, and David mourned him (2 Sm 13:20–19:10).

Adam The first man created by God, and the father of all humankind (Gn 1:26–2:25). He and his wife Eve disobeyed God (Gn 3), and sin entered the world as a curse for their actions (Rom 5:12–21).

adder A poisonous snake (Ps 58:4; Prv 23:32).

adultery Being unfaithful to one's husband or wife (Mt 5:28). Spiritual adultery is when a person is unfaithful to God (Gn 3).

advertise To tell, or inform.

Nm 24:14 I will **a** thee what

advocate One who speaks favorably about another person, or in defense of the other person. Jesus is called our advocate (1 Jn 2:1).

affliction Considerable distress, trouble, or pain (Is 48:10; Lam 3:1).

agape A word that means "love" or "charity" in Greek (1 Cor 13).

Agrippa The king of Judæa who imprisoned Paul and heard his plea for freedom (Acts 25:13–26:32).

ARAMEAN

Ahab An evil king of Israel during Elijah's lifetime. His marriage to Jezebel displeased God when she led Israel to worship the false god Baal (1 Kgs 16:29–22:40).

Ahasuerus King of Persia (Ezr 4:6) and husband of Esther (Est 1–2). Issued an edict allowing Jews to defend themselves against Haman's plot to destroy them (Est 8). Also called Artaxerxes.

alien A stranger or foreigner (Ps 69:8).

Alleluia Hebrew for "Praise the LORD." Often used as a shout of praise as well as the command to praise the Lord.

Rv 19:1 a great voice of much people in heaven, saying, **A**;

Almighty, the A name of God, which shows his strength and power.

Gn 17:1 I am the **A** God; walk before me, Rv 4:8 Holy, holy, LORD God **A**,

Alpha and Omega The first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, which are used to represent "the beginning and the end" (Rv 21:6; 22:13).

Altar A table, or platform, used for sacrifices (Gn 8:20).

amen A Hebrew word that means "truly," "I agree," or "so be it."

Amos 1) Prophet from Tekoa (Am 1:1; 7:10–17). 2) An ancestor of Jesus (Lk 3:25).

Ananias 1) A Christian man who lived in Jerusalem and was married to Sapphira; he was struck down by God for his dishonesty in the sale of his property (Acts 5:1–10). 2) A Christian man from Damascus who baptized Saul (Acts 9:10–19). 3) A high priest of Jerusalem before whom Paul was tried (Acts 22:30–24:1). **Ancient of days** The judge in Daniel's vision: probably intended to be God himself (Dn 7:9, 13, 22).

Andrew One of Jesus' original twelve apostles and the brother of Simon Peter (Mt 4:18; 10:2; Acts 1:13).

angel A heavenly being or messenger (1 Kgs 13:18; Ps 8:5; Mt 4:11; Lk 1:26).

angel of the LORD The heavenly messenger whose presence is evidence of God Himself (Gn 16:7; Ex 3:2; Nm 22:23; 1 Kgs 19:7; Mt 28:2; Lk 1:11; 2:9).

anoint To pour oil on a person's head in ceremony (Ex 28:41), or for physical benefit (Jas 5:14).

antichrist Opponent or enemy of Christ.

1 Jn 2:22 He is **a**, that denieth 2 Jn 7 deceiver and an **a**

Antioch 1) Located in Syria; the name "Christian" was coined here (Acts 11:26).
2) Located in Pisidia; a place where Paul and Barnabas traveled (Acts 13:14–52).

apocalypse A revelation; disclosure; usually a vision. Sometimes used as the title of the NT book of Revelation.

apostle One of the twelve men Jesus chose to be his disciples (Mt 10:2–4; Mk 3:14). Men and women who learned about Jesus and became Christian leaders (Acts 14:14; Rom 16:7; Gal 1:1).

Arabia; Arabian The northwest region of the large peninsula in southwest Asia where numerous biblical events occurred. The Arab people were usually nomads.

Aramean A Semitic descendant of Shem, Noah's oldest son (Gn 10:1, 21–31). The Arameans were nomads and wandered around the Syrian desert.

Ararat Located in Armenia, it is the resting place of Noah's ark (Gn 8:4).

archangel An angel of the highest order.

ark of the covenant Also called the "ark of the testimony," it contained a pot of manna, the tablets of the covenant (the Ten Commandments), and Aaron's rod that budded. It was kept in the most holy place in the tabernacle. It reminded the Israelites of God's presence (Ex 25:10–22; Heb 9:4).

Armageddon The location of the final battle between good and evil (Rv 16:16).

Artaxerxes 1) King of Persia, who allowed the rebuilding of the temple under Ezra (Ezr 4; 7), and of Jerusalem's walls under his cupbearer Nehemiah (Neh 2; 5:14; 13:6). 2) *See* "Ahasuerus."

ascension, the When Christ returned to heaven (Lk 24:51; Acts 1:9), forty days after the resurrection.

Ascents, Song of Psalms sung on the journey (ascent) to Jerusalem (Pss 120–134). See "degrees, Song of."

Ash Wednesday The first day of the Lenten season.

Asher Son of Jacob by Zilpah (Gn 30:13; 35:26; 46:17; Ex 1:4; 1 Chr 2:2). His descendants make up one of the tribes of Israel (Dt 33:24–25).

Asia A Roman province, located in presentday Asia Minor (Acts 16:6; 20:18; 1 Pt 1:1; Rv 1:4). **Assyria** A powerful nation in Mesopotamia from the third millennium B.C. until 600 B.C. Its capital was Nineveh and it often attacked the Israelites.

atonement, day of An annual day when the Jews would fast in order to pay for their sins and be forgiven (Lv 23:27).

Ave Maria Latin for "Hail, Mary!" Elizabeth's greeting and blessing for Mary, the mother of Jesus (Lk 1:28, 42); it became a prayer in the liturgical church.

B

Baal A fertility god of Canaan; one of the many false gods they worshipped.

Jer 2:8 the prophets prophesied by **B**, Rom 11:4 to the image of **B**.

Babel The Hebrew word meaning "Babylon"; the site of the tower of Babel.

Gn 11:9 Therefore is the name of it called **B**;

Babylon The capital city of Babylonia.

Ps 137:8 **B**, who art to be destroyed;

Rv 14:8 **B** is fallen, is fallen,

baptism A symbolic ceremony in which one is immersed in or sprinkled with water to enter into the church family. The ceremony represents when Jesus died and rose from the dead, allowing people to become free from sin.

Bartholomew One of the twelve disciples of Jesus (Mt 10:3; Lk 6:14). He may have also been called Nathanael (Jn 21:2).

Baruch The scribe, or secretary, of Jeremiah (Jer 36:4).

bath A liquid measure that is equivalent to the dry measure "ephah" (Ez 45:11); about six gallons.

beast A term used for all living things or animals, except humans. In Revelation, the word describes heavenly "animals" and the evil beast from the bottomless pit.

Is 35:9 nor any ravenous **b** shall go Rv 11:7 **b** that ascendeth out of the bottomless pit

Beatitudes A series of blessings listed in the Sermon on the Mount by Jesus (Mt 5:3-12).

begotten Having been brought into being. Jn 1:18 the only **b** Son,

benediction Often spoken by a minister or priest at the end of a church service; asking for God's blessing or declaring a blessing to the people.

Benjamin Twelfth son of Jacob by Rachel (Gn 35:16–24; 46:19–21; 1 Chr 2:2). His descendants make up one of the tribes of Israel (Dt 33:12).

Bethany A small village on the mount of Olives, where Jesus made his entry into Jerusalem (Mk 11:1–11).

Beth-el A city near Jerusalem, which was the site of many historic events (Gn 12:8; Gn 35:10–15; Jgs 20:18–28; 1 Kgs 12:29–13:32; 2 Kgs 23:4–15).

Bethlehem; Beth-lehem A town in Judah/ Judæa that was associated with Ruth (Ru 1–4) and David (1 Sm 17; Jn 7:42). It was the birthplace of Jesus (Mt 2:1). **birthright** The rights or privileges of the firstborn son in the family (Gn 25:34).

bishop A high-ranking church minister (1 Tm 3:1–7), also translated as "overseer." Ti 1:7 For a **b** must be blameless,

blood The life-giving fluid of the body that represents life itself. In the OT, blood sacrifices were used to atone for sin. In the NT, Jesus' blood, shed on the cross, symbolizes his death that paid for the salvation of all who believe in him.

Lv 1:5 Aaron's sons, shall bring the **b**, Lk 22:20 the new testament in my **b**,

Boaz The husband of Ruth; an ancestor of David and Jesus (Ru 4; Mt 1:5–16).

booths, feast of A seven-day festival in the seventh month of the Israelite calendar, also translated as "the feast of tabernacles" (Lv 23:33–43; Dt 16:13– 17). All Israelites were to live in temporary shelters ("booths" or "tabernacles") to commemorate God's care of the Israelites in the wilderness after the exodus.

bread The most important food during biblical times. Jesus called himself the "bread of life" because he is necessary for eternal life as bread is necessary for physical life.

catholic Universal; worldwide (as used in the Apostles' Creed); broad; extensive.

cherubim Creatures with wings that were attached to the ark of the testimony. They are usually depicted to resemble a combination of angels, animals, and humans (Ex 25:18).

children of Israel The descendants of Jacob (Israel), also called "Israelites" and "Hebrews."

Psalmist (Mt 22:43– 45), musician (Am 6:5), and prophet (2 Sm 23:2–7; Acts 1:16; 2:30).

ephah A dry measure equal to the liquid measure bath; estimated as three-eighths to two-thirds of a bushel.

Ephesus; Ephesians A seaport in the Roman province of Asia; visited by Paul on his second and third journeys. Paul's NT epistle to the Ephesians seems to be a general letter to the churches of Asia Minor.

Ephraim 1) Second son of Joseph (Gn 41:52; 46:20). He was blessed as firstborn by Jacob (Gn 48). His descendants make up one of the tribes of Israel (Dt 33:17). 2) A term for the northern kingdom of Israel (Is 7:17; Hos 5).

Epiphany A festival of the church celebrated on January 6, to commemorate the Magi visiting the child Jesus.

episcopal A type of church government, meaning to be governed by bishops or overseers.

epistle Another term for "letter." All the books of the NT from Romans through the first three chapters of Revelation are letters or epistles.

Esau The firstborn son of Isaac and Rebekah; Jacob was his younger twin brother, to whom he sold his birthright (Gn 25:21–26, 29–34; 27).

Essenes A Jewish sect before and during NT times. They strictly followed Jewish laws and were known for rituals of purification.

Esther A Jewish woman who lived in Persia (Est 2:7). She became queen and wife of Ahasuerus (Est 2:8–18) and was able to foil a plot to kill all the Jews (Est 8–9).

Eucharist Literally "thanksgiving"; the name sometimes used by Christians to refer to the rite of the Lord's Supper.

Euphrates A large river in Mesopotamia.

The Last Supper symbolizes the sacrifice of Christ and the new covenant (1 Cor 10:16).

Holy Ghost; Holy Spirit The third person of the Trinity. He was active in the creation (Gn 1:2). He came at Pentecost to live in and empower the church and individual believers (Acts 2; 1 Cor 3:16;

6:19). He works in the lives of believers as their advocate (Jn 14:16–17, 26). He is the guarantee of salvation (2 Cor 5:5; Eph 1:13). *See also* "Spirit of the Lord."

 - 1 Sm 1:7 she went up to the **h** of the LORD,
- Jer 31:31 covenant with the **h** of Israel, and with the **h** of Judah:
- **idol** An icon, statue, or figure, worshiped as if it has the power of a god.

1 Cor 8:4 an i is nothing in the world,

image A likeness, illustration, idol, or representation.

- **Incarnation** The act of God taking on humanity in the person of Jesus (Jn 1:14; 1 Jn 4:2).
- **iniquity** Evil, wickedness, sin, or crime. *See also* "sin."

Ex 34:7 forgiving **i** and transgression and sin, Ps 32:2 unto whom the LORD imputeth not **i**,

intercession A mediation, negotiation, or plea, on behalf of another person. Christ intercedes with the Father on behalf of believers (Jn 17:6–26).

Is 53:12 and made **i** for the transgressors. Heb 7:25 ever liveth to make **i** for them. **Isaac** The son God promised to Abraham and Sarah (Gn 17:19; 21:1–17; 1 Chr 1:28); Abraham offered him as a sacrifice to God (Gn 22); he is the father of twins Esau and Jacob, with his wife Rebekah (Gn 25:19–26).

- **Isaiah; Esias** A prophet of Israel, called by the Lord to prophesy to Judah. The book of Isaiah is the first book of the Major Prophets (Is 1:1; 6). He prophesied about the Messiah.
- **Israel** 1) The new name Jacob received after he struggled with an angel at Peniel (Gn 32:22–30). *See also* "Jacob." 2) The nation descended from Jacob/Israel. 3) The land in which the Israelites lived.
- Gn 32:28 called no more Jacob, but I: Gn 49:28 these are the twelve tribes of I:
- **Issachar** Son of Jacob by Leah (Gn 30:18; 35:23; 1 Chr 2:1). His descendants make up one of the tribes of Israel (Dt 33:18–19).

J

Jacob The second-born son of Isaac and Rebekah; he bought his older twin brother Esau's birthright; married sisters Leah and Rachel, his uncle Laban's daughters; wrestled with God and was renamed Israel. His twelve sons are the ancestors of the nation of Israel (Gn 25:21–34; 27–35; 37:1–3; 47:28–49:33). *See also* "Israel."

Is 44:1 Yet now hear, O J my servant; Ez 39:25 bring again the captivity of J,

James The name of five men in the NT: 1) One of the 12 apostles; the brother of John and son of Zebedee (Mt 4:21; 10:2; 17:1; 20:20; 26:37). 2) Another of the 12 apostles; son of Alpheus (Mt 10:3; Mk 3:18). 3) One of Mary's sons—some believe that that (2) and (3) James are the same person (Mt 27:56; Mk 15:40). 4) Judas' father (Lk 6:16; Acts 1:13). 5) Jesus' brother, who wrote the letter of James (Mt 13:55; Acts 12:17; Jas 1:1).

JEALOUS

- **jealous** Envious of another person; to covet something another possesses; to guard one's possessions.
- Dt 4:24 a consuming fire, even a **j** God. Dt 5:9 I the LORD thy God am a **j** God, Dt 32:16 They provoked him to **j**
- **Jehovah** A translation of "Yahweh," the proper name of God.
- **Jephthah** A judge from Gilead who defeated the Ammonites and then sacrificed his daughter to fulfill a vow (Jgs 11:1-12:7).
- **Jeremiah; Jeremias** 1) An OT prophet, whose story is told in the second book of the Major Prophets (Jer 1:1–3). 2) The name of nine other men in the OT.
- **Jericho** An ancient city in the Jordan valley. It was conquered and destroyed by Joshua and the Israelites (Jo 6). In NT times, it was the site where Jesus healed the blind man Bartimeus (Mk 10:46–52).
- Jo 3:16 people passed over right against **J**. Jo 6:2 given into thine hand **J**,
- **Jeroboam** 1) Son of Nebat. One of Solomon's officials, who rebelled, became the first king of Israel, and reigned for 22 years (1 Kgs 11:26–14:20; 2 Chr 10:2–15; 13:1–20). 2) Son of Jehoash, a powerful king of Israel, who reigned for 41 years (2 Kgs 14:23–29).
- **Jerusalem** The sacred city of the Jews and Christians, the site of important biblical events. Also called Salem, City of David, and Zion (2 Sm 5:6–9; 1 Chr 11:4–8; Lk 2:22–38; Jn 2:13–25). In the new heavens and new earth, the new Jerusalem will be the home of God and his people (Rv 21:2–14).
- 2 Sm 15:29carried the ark of God again to J:1 Kgs 9:19Solomon desired to build in J,Mt 2:1wise men from the east to J,Mt 23:37O J, J, thou that killest the prophets,Rv 3:12new J, which cometh downRv 21:2the holy city, new J,

Jesse The father of King David, grandson of Boaz and Ruth, and ancestor of Jesus Christ (1 Sm 16:1–13; 17:12).

Jesus Christ The Son of God, second person of the Trinity, Messiah of Israel and Saviour of the world.

Events in the Life of Jesus. Genealogy (Mt 1:1–17; Lk 3:21-37). Birth announced (Mt 1:18-25; Lk 1:26-45). Birth (Mt 2:1-12; Lk 2:1-40). Escape to Egypt (Mt 2:13-23). Last Supper (Mt 26:17-35; Mk 14:12-31; Lk 22:1-38; Jn 13-17). Arrest and trial (Mt 26:36-27:31; Mk 14:43-15:20; Lk 22:39-23:25; Jn 18:1–19:16). Crucifixion (Mt 27:32–66; Mk 15:21-47; Lk 23:26-55; Jn 19:28-42). Resurrection and appearances (Mt 28; Mk 16; Lk 24; Jn 20–21; Acts 1:1–11; 7:56; 9:3–6; 1 Cor 15:1–8; Rv 1:1–20).

Miracles of Jesus. Healings: nobleman's 4:43–54), son (In demoniac in Capernaum (Mk 1:23–26; Lk 4:33–35), Peter's mother-in-law (Mt 8:14-17; Mk 1:29-31; Lk 4:38-39), leper (Mt 8:2-4; Mk 1:40-45; Lk 5:12-16), paralytic (Mt 9:1-8; Mk 2:1-12; Lk 5:17-26), cripple (Jn 5:1-9), withered hand (Mt 12:10-13; Mk 3:1-5; Lk 6:6-11), centurion's servant (Mt 8:5-13; Lk 7:1-10), widow's raised (Lk 7:11-17), demoniac son (Mt 12:22-23; Lk 11:14), Gadarene

(Mt 13:52), good Samaritan (Lk 10:25– 37), unforgiving servant (Mt 18:15–35), lost sheep (Mt 18:10–14; Lk 15:4–7), lost coin (Lk 15:8–10), prodigal son (Lk 15:11–32), unjust steward (Lk 16:1–13), rich man and Lazarus (Lk 16:19–31), persistent widow (Lk 18:1–8), Pharisee and publican (Lk 18:9–14), payment of laborers (Mt 20:1–16), two sons (Mt 21:28–32), husbandmen and the vineyard (Mt 21:33–46; Mk 12:1–12; Lk 20:9–19), wedding banquet (Mt 22:1– 14), faithful servant (Mt 24:45–51), ten virgins (Mt 25:1–13), talents (Mt 25:1– 30; Lk 19:12–27).

- **Jesus** was a common name in NT times, as it is the Greek form of "Joshua." In addition to Jesus Christ, there is one other Jesus in the NT, a disciple, also called Justus (Col 4:11).
- **Jews** Another name for the Hebrew people, or Israelites, the descendants of Abraham and Jacob. It first appears after the exile (Ezr 4:12; Neh 1:2; Est 2:1). Jesus was called the "King of the Jews" (Mt 27:11, 37; Mk 15:2, 12, 26; Lk 23:3, 38; Jn 18:33, 39; 19:3, 19).

Mt 27:37 THIS IS JESUS THE KING OF THE J.

- **Jezebel** A Phoenician princess who was married to King Ahab of Israel. She opposed the prophet Elijah and God of Israel by promoting the worship of the god Baal (1 Kgs 16:30–31; 19:1–2; 21:5–25; 2 Kgs 9:30–37).
- **Job** The main character of the book of Job, a wealthy man of Uz who was faithful to God (Jb 1:1–5), despite being tested by Satan (Jb 1:6–22; 2). He was vindicated and restored to greater stature by God (Jb 42) and became an example of righteousness (Ez 14:14, 20).

JOEL

- **Joel** 1) One of Samuel's sons (1 Sm 8:2; 1 Chr 6:28). 2) An OT prophet and author of the second book of the Minor Prophets (J1 1:1).
- John Apostle who wrote the Gospel of John; brother of James (Mt 4:21–22; 10:2; Mk 3:17; Lk 5:1–10). He was present at the transfiguration (Mt 17:1–13; Mk 9:1–13; Lk 9:28–36) He became a leader of the church at Jerusalem (Acts 4:1–3; Gal 2:9). Many scholars also consider the apostle John to be the elder who wrote the letters of John (1 Jn, 2 Jn; 3 Jn) and the prophet who wrote Revelation (Rv 1:1; 22:8).
- John Mark Cousin of Barnabas, and coworker with Paul (Acts 12:12–13:13; 15:37). *See also* "Mark."
- John the Baptist Son of Zechariah and Elizabeth (Lk 1). Called the Baptist (Mt 3:1–12; Mk 1:2–8). He witnessed to Jesus' coming (Mt 3:11–12; Mk 1:7–8; Lk 3:15–18; Jn 1:6–35; 3:27–30; 5:33– 36) and was executed (Mt 14:1–12; Mk 6:14–29; Lk 9:7–9). Jesus compared John's ministry to that of Elijah (Mt 11:7– 19; Mk 9:11–13; Lk 7:24–35).
- **Jonah; Jonas** The prophet who fled to Tarshish instead of preaching to Nineveh; he was swallowed by a large fish due to his rebellion (Jon 1:17–2:10). The fifth book of the Minor Prophets is named after him.
- **Jonathan** Son of Saul (1 Sm 13:16; 1 Chr 8:33). He was a valiant warrior (1 Sm 13–14) and a close friend to David (1 Sm 18:1–4; 19–20; 23:16–18). He was killed with his father at Gilboa (1 Sm 31), and was mourned by David (2 Sm 1).

- Joppa; Japho The seaport for Jerusalem during biblical times (Jo 19:46; 2 Chr 2:16; Jon 1:3; Acts 9:36–43).
- 2 Chr 2:16 bring it to thee in floats by sea to **J**; Jon 1:3 down to **J**; and he found a ship
- **Jordan** The main river of Israel; its waters were miraculously parted for the Israelites (Jo 3:14–4:24). Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan.
- Dt 3:27 thou shalt not go over this **J**. Jo 1:2 arise, go over this **J**, Jo 3:17 dry ground in the midst of **J**,
- **Joseph** 1) Son of Jacob by Rachel (Gn 30:24; 1 Chr 2:2). He was favored by Jacob, but hated by his brothers, who sold him into slavery (Gn 37). He interpreted dreams of Pharaoh and his servants, and was made greatest in Egypt (Gn 40–41). He sold grain to his brothers (Gn 42–45) and brought Jacob and his family to Egypt (Gn 46–47). 2) Husband of Mary the mother of Jesus (Mt 1:16–24; 2:13–19; Lk 1:27; 2; Jn 1:45).
- Joseph of Arimathæa A disciple from Arimathæa who buried Jesus in his own tomb (Mt 27:57–61; Mk 15:43–47; Lk 24:50–52).
- **Joses** Original name of Barnabas (Acts 4:36). *See also* "Barnabas."
- Joshua; Jeshua 1) Joshua, son of Nun, was Moses' helper, and later took over leadership of the Israelites and led them into the promised land; the book of Joshua tells his story (Nm 13:8; Dt 31:1–18; Jo 3:14—4:24; 6:1–21; 10–12). 2) A high priest during the rebuilding of the temple (Hg 1–2; Zec 3:1–9; 6:11).

Judah 1) Son of Jacob by Leah (Gn 29:35; 35:23; 1 Chr 2:1). He did not want to kill his brother Joseph (Gn 37:26–27). His descendants make up one of the twelve tribes of Israel (Dt 33:7). 2) Name used for people and land of southern kingdom. *See also* "Judæa."

Is 3:8 Jerusalem is ruined, and **J** is fallen:

Judas Greek form of "Judah." 1) Judas, brother of James and Jesus (Mt 13:55; Mk 6:3), who was also called Jude (Jude 1). He is crediting with writing the epistle of Jude. 2) Judas Barsabas, a Christian prophet (Acts 15:22–32). 3) Judas Iscariot, the apostle who betrayed Jesus (Mt 10:4; 26:14–56; Mk 3:19; 14:10–50; Lk 6:16; 22:3–53; Jn 6:71; 12:4; 13:2–30; 18:2– 11) and committed suicide (Mt 27:3–5; Acts 1:16–25).

- Judæa The name used in the NT for the southern kingdom, called Judah in the OT. See also "Judah."
- Mt 3:1 preaching in the wilderness of **J**,
- Acts 9:31 then had the churches rest throughout all \mathbf{J} ,
- **judge** To determine if something is right or wrong; to evaluate. The book of Judges speaks of men and women who led the tribes of Israel in battle and helped determine justice in disputes between people.
 - Dt 17:9 unto the priests the Levites, and unto the \boldsymbol{j}
 - Jgs 2:16 the LORD raised up j,
 - Ez 7:3 I will **j** thee according to thy ways,

Lord's Supper The final supper Jesus shared with his disciples; also Communion, the celebration of the Last Supper. *See* "Last Supper"; "Holy Communion."

Lot Nephew of Abraham (Gn 11:27; 12:5). He chose to live in Sodom (Gn 13); was rescued from four kings (Gn 14). He was rescued from Sodom before its destruction (Gn 19:1–29; 2 Pt 2:7). His wife was turned into a pillar of salt (Gn 19:1–38).

love To adore, feel affection for, or worship.

man Refers to all humankind or any individual.

Marcus; Mark; John Mark A cousin of Barnabas and co-worker with Paul. He is traditionally understood to be the author of the Gospel of Mark (Acts 12:12, 25; 15:37).

- Mary 1) Mother of Jesus (Mt 1:16–25; Lk 1:27–56; 2:1–40). She witnessed the miracle at the wedding in Cana (Jn 2:1–5), and was present at Jesus' crucifixion (Jn 19:25–27). After his ascension, she remained among the disciples (Acts 1:14). 2) Sister of Martha and Lazarus (Jn 11) who washed Jesus' feet (Jn 12:1–8). 3) Mother of James and Joses; she witnessed the crucifixion (Mt 27:56; Mk 15:40) and the empty tomb (Mk 16:1; Lk 24:10).
- Mary Magdalene A woman whom Jesus freed from demonic possession (Lk 8:2); she helped support Jesus' ministry (Lk 8:1–3). She witnessed his crucifixion (Mt 27:56; Mk 15:40; Jn 19:25) and burial (Mt 27:61; Mk 15:47). According to John, she was also the first to see Jesus after his resurrection (Jn 20:1–18).

master Someone with power and authority; an owner. God is Master of all.

Gn 24:12 shew kindness unto my **m** Abraham. Jn 13:14 your Lord and **M**, have washed Col 4:1 ye also have a **M** in heaven.

Matthew Apostle; a former tax collector (Mt 9:9–13; 10:3; Mk 3:18; Lk 6:15; Acts 1:13). He was also called Levi (Mk 2:14–17; Lk 5:27–32). He is traditionally credited with writing the first Gospel.

mediator One who acts as a moderator or negotiator between two persons or groups, such as when Moses mediated between God and Israel. Christ is the mediator between God and humankind.

1 Tm 2:5 one **m** between God and men,

Heb 8:6 he is the \mathbf{m} of a better covenant,

meditate To ponder, contemplate, or reflect on deliberately and carefully.

- **Meshach** A Hebrew exiled to Babylon, whose name was changed from Mishael (Dn 1:6–7). He refused defilement by food (Dn 1:8–20) and did not worship the king's idol (Dn 3:1–18). He was saved from the furnace (Dn 3:19–30).
- **Messiah; Messias** Hebrew word meaning "anointed." In ancient Israel, individuals were anointed to be a prophet, priest, or king. Jesus is the ultimate Anointed One, sent by God to save humankind.

- **Methuselah** The oldest person recorded in the Bible; he lived to be 969 years old. He was Noah's grandfather (Gn 5:27).

ministry Doing work for God.

miracle Something that goes against typical laws of nature. Miracles are done through God's power.

mite A copper coin of small value.

Mk 12:42 widow...threw in two $\boldsymbol{m}.$

Mordecai A Benjamite exile who raised Esther (Est 2:5–15). He refused to honor Haman (Est 3:1–6; 5:9–14), and charged Esther to foil Haman's plot against the Jews (Est 4). He established the festival of Purim (Est 9:18–32).

Moses A Levite; brother of Aaron and Miriam (Ex 6:20; 1 Chr 6:3). He was called by the Lord to deliver Israel and lead the people out of Egypt (Ex 3–4). He received the Law at mount Sinai (Ex 19–23; 25–31; Jn 1:17). This series of commandments is sometimes called the "law of Moses" (1 Kgs 2:3; Ezr 3:2; Lk 24:44) or the "book of Moses" (2 Chr 25:12; Neh 13:1; Mk 12:26). The first five books of the OT and Psalm 90 are traditionally attributed to him.

most High, the A title used to describe God as more important and powerful than anyone else (Dt 32:8; Dn 4:25).

mourn To grieve or lament.

Mt 5:4 Blessed are they that **m**, Lk 6:25 for ye shall **m** and weep.

myrrh Sap from the myrrh bush, used to make sacred anointing oil, incense, and perfume.

Sg 3:6 perfumed with **m** and frankincense,

Mt 2:11 gifts; gold, and frankincense, and **m**.

Nahum A prophet who spoke against the city of Nineveh (Na 1:1).

name The word or title by which a person, place, or thing is known. To believe in, or on, Jesus' name means to believe in Jesus as Saviour. To come in someone's name means to represent them.

Nathan Prophet and a writer of Israel's history (1 Chr 29:29; 2 Chr 9:29). He announced God's covenant with David (2 Sm 7; 1 Chr 17), and denounced David's sin with Bath-sheba (2 Sm 12). He supported David's son Solomon as king (1 Kgs 1).

Nazareth The town in Galilee where Jesus' mother Mary lived, and where Jesus was raised (Lk 1:26; 2:39, 51).

Jn 1:46 Can there any good thing come out of N?

Nebuchadnezzar; Nebuchadrezzar The Babylonian king who subdued and exiled Judah (2 Kgs 24–25; 2 Chr 36; Jer 39). His dreams were interpreted by the prophet Daniel (Dn 2; 4).

Nehemiah The cupbearer of King Artaxerxes who helped to rebuild Jerusalem after the Babylonian exile (Neh 2–6). His story is told in the book of Nehemiah.

Nineveh The capital of Assyria. Jonah was sent to this city to preach (Jon 1:2). Nahum predicted its judgment and fall (Nah 1–3).

Noah; Noe A righteous man (Ez 14:14, 20) called by God to build an ark to save God's creation from the flood (Gn 6–8; Heb 11:7; 1 Pt 3:20; 2 Pt 2:5). The rainbow is God's covenant with him (Gn 9:1–17).

Nunc Dimittis The Latin name of the blessing given by Simeon when the infant Jesus was presented in the temple (Lk 2:29–32).

- **Obadiah** 1) A man who hid 100 prophets from Jezebel (1 Kgs 18:1–16). 2) Prophet who spoke against Edom (Ob 1).
- offering Something given in worship to God. In OT times, animals were sacrificed as offerings for sin, and sometimes it is food or other objects were dedicated to God's service. Jesus gave his life as an offering to atone for the sins of the world. *See also* "sacrifice."

- **Palestine** A name for Canaan in Roman times.
- **Palm Sunday** The Sunday before Easter, which celebrates Jesus' entry into Jerusalem before he was betrayed, tried, and crucified (Jn 12:12–19).
- **parable** A short story that teaches a moral lesson or truth. Jesus often spoke in parables (Mt 13). Mt 13:18 Hear ye therefore the **p**

Mt 15:15 Declare unto us this \mathbf{p} .

- **Parousia, the** A Greek word describing the second coming of Christ at the end of history (Mt 24:3–44; 1 Cor 15:23; 1 Thes 2:19).
- **Passover** An annual Jewish holiday that commemorates when God freed the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt. The Lord "passed over" the houses with lamb's blood on the doorways and spared their firstborn, but the firstborn sons in Egypt were killed (Ex 12–13). Jesus' final meal with his disciples was a Passover meal (Mt 26:17–19).
- **Pastoral Epistles** Paul's letters to Timothy and Titus, who were pastors in Ephesus and Crete. Many of the teachings in these books relate to church leadership.
- **Paul** Originally called Saul (Acts 13:9); a Pharisee from Tarsus (Acts 9:11; Phil 3:5) who witnessed the stoning of Stephen (Acts 8:1) and persecuted the church (Acts 9:1–2; Gal 1:13). He saw a vision of Jesus on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:4–9; 26:12–18) and became a believer. As an apostle (Gal 1) he spread the gospel throughout the Roman world (Acts 13– 28). He wrote the thirteen NT letters, from Romans through Philemon.

peace Freedom from strife and war; wholeness and health. To have peace with God is to be completely restored to right relationship with God.

Peter; Simon Peter A fisherman on the sea of Galilee who was called with his brother Andrew by Jesus (Mt 4:18–20; Mk 1:16–18; Lk 5:1–11; Jn 1:35–41). He became the "first" of the 12 apostles (Mt 10:2), and sometimes spoke for all the disciples. Jesus changed his name from Simon to Peter (Mt 16:18; Mk 3:16; Lk 6:14; Jn 1:42). His mother-in-law was healed by Jesus (Mt 8:14–15; Mk 1:30–31; Lk 4:38–39); he confessed that Jesus was the Christ (Mt 16:16; Mk 8:29; Lk 9:20) but also denied Jesus (Mt 26:69–75; Mk 14:66–72; Lk 22:54–62). He is the author of two NT epistles.

Pharisees A major and influential Jewish sect in the days of Jesus. They were known for following the law very carefully. Some of the Pharisees opposed the teachings of Jesus and conspired against him (Mt 16:1–12; Mk 10:2; 12:13). Many of Jesus' followers were originally Pharisees, such as Nicodemus (Jn 3:1) and Paul (Acts 23:6).

Rachel Daughter of Laban (Gn 29:16) and Leah's younger sister. She became Jacob's second wife (Gn 29:28) and bore two sons, Joseph and Benjamin (Gn 29:1–31:35; 35:16–19).

Rebekah Wife of Isaac and mother of twins Esau and Jacob (Gn 24–25). She encouraged Jacob to fool Isaac into giving him Esau's blessing (Gn 27:1–17).

Red sea; Sea of Reeds The body of water separating Egypt from the Sinai Peninsula. God miraculously parted its waters so the Israelites could escape from Egypt in the exodus (Ex 14:21–31).

redeemer One who saves, rescues, liberates, or ransoms. Jesus is the ultimate Redeemer because he died to rescue people from their sin (Lk 24:21; Ti 2:14).

Jb 19:25 For I know that my **R** liveth,

Ps 19:14 O LORD, my strength and my **r**.

repent To regret, feel sorrow, or turn away from sin, and promise to not repeat the sin.

Reuben; Reubenites Firstborn of Jacob by Leah (Gn 29:32; 46:8; 1 Chr 2:1). He lost his birthright for sleeping with Bilhah (Gn 35:22; 49:4). His descendants make up one of the twelve tribes of Israel (Gn 49:3–4; Dt 33:6).

revelation When something previously hidden or secret is made known.

Gal 1:12 by the \mathbf{r} of Jesus Christ

reward The verb means to give someone a gift for something they have done. The noun means the gift someone receives for doing something.

riches Treasures, valuable materials, property. Sometimes pursuing riches can get in the way of following God.

righteousness What is just, right and godly. The believer's right standing with God, which comes from Jesus Christ.

Rock A title of God that symbolizes his strength and stability.

Rome; Roman The most powerful empire in the world in the time of Christ. Rome was the capital of the Roman Empire. Paul wrote the Epistle to the Romans to the church in this important city.

Acts 18:2 had commanded all Jews to leave R:

Ruth A widow from Moab; she traveled to Israel with her mother-in-law Naomi (Ru 1). She married Boaz and they became ancestors of David and Jesus (Ru 4:13– 22; Mt 1:5).

S

sabbath The last day of a seven-day week. Israel was commanded to honor the sabbath as a day of rest in OT times (Ex 20:8; Dt 5:12). Jesus had conflicts with religious leaders because he healed people on the sabbath (Mt 12:1–14).

Mk 2:28 the Son of man is Lord also of the \mathbf{s} .

sacrament In some church traditions, an important ceremony. Baptism and the Lord's Supper are the most universally recognized ceremonies.

sacrifice An offering made to God (or a false god), usually the life of an animal. In the NT, Jesus became the sacrifice for the sins of the world. *See also* "offering."
Ex 12:27 It is the s of the LORD's passover, 1 Cor 10:20 they s to devils, and not to God.

Sadducees A Jewish sect during the time of Christ. They were often rich and politically influential and opposed the Pharisees. Many Sadducees opposed the teachings of Jesus (Mt 16:1–12).

Mt 22:34 heard that he had put the **S** to silence, Mk 12:18 **S**, which say there is no resurrection;

salt A preservative or seasoning sometimes used in offerings (Lv 2:13). It sometimes symbolizes the positive influence of Christians in the world.

Gn 19:26 and she became a pillar of **s**.

Mt 5:13 Ye are the **s** of the earth:

salt sea, the The lake at the southern end of the Jordan River (Gn 14:3; Nm 34:3, 12; Dt 3:17). It is known today as the Dead Sea.

salvation To be rescued or delivered from the consequences of sin. Jesus brought salvation to those who believe in him by sacrificing his life on the cross.

Ps 38:22 make haste to help me, O LORD my **s**. Lk 1:77 to give knowledge of **s** unto his people Lk 3:6 all flesh shall see the **s** of God.

Samaria; Samaritan 1) Capital city of the northern kingdom of Israel (1 Kgs 16:24–28). In the NT, the region between Galilee and Judæa (Jn 4:1). 2) A person from Samaria in NT times. The Samaritans worshiped God differently from the Jews, and the Jews of Galilee and Judæa disliked the Samaritans and avoided them (Lk 10:30–37).

Lk 10:33 But a **S**, as he journeyed,

Jn 4:7 There cometh a woman of **S** to draw water:

Jn 8:48 that thou art a **S**, and hast a demon?

Samson A judge known for great feats of strength: he killed a lion (Jgs 14:6), 30 Philistines (Jgs 14:19), 1,000 Philistines (Jgs 15:13–17); he carried off gates of Gaza (Jgs 16:3). He was betrayed by Delilah (Jgs 16:1–22) and died while killing many Philistines in the temple of Dagon (Jgs 16:23–31; Heb 11:32).

Samuel An Ephraimite judge and prophet (1 Sm 3; Heb 11:32). He led Israel to victory over the Philistines (1 Sm 7). He anointed Saul as the first king of Israel (1 Sm 9–10) and anointed David as king to replace Saul (1 Sm 16).

sanctify To set apart for God's service, to consecrate or make holy.

- Jn 17:17 **S** them through thy truth: thy word is truth.
- Jn 17:19 And for their sakes I **s** myself,
- 1 Thes 5:23 the very God of peace **s** you wholly;

sanctuary A building used as a holy place of worship for God.

Ex 25:8 And let them make me a **s**, Ez 5:11 because thou hast defiled my **s**

- Sarah; Sarai Wife of Abraham, originally named Sarai. She was not able to bear children (Gn 11:29–31; 1 Pt 3:6), but was enabled by God to bear Isaac when she was 90 (Gn 17:15–21; 18:10–15; Heb 11:11).
- **Satan** A former angel who rebelled against God and fell from heaven (Rv 12:7–9). He is God's adversary and is also called the Devil.

Mt 16:23 Get thee behind me, S:

Lk 10:18 I beheld **S** as lightning fall from heaven.

Saul The first king of Israel, anointed by Samuel; God later rejected him because of his disobedience, and David replaced him as king (1 Sm 9–31).

Saul of Tarsus See "Paul."

saviour Someone who delivers or rescues people from a bad situation. Jesus is called Saviour because he saves believers from the penalty of death.

scripture A portion or the entirety of the Bible, the Word of God. In NT times, scripture referred to the OT, though some letters of Paul were beginning to be recognized as scripture (2 Pt 3:16). By the fourth century after Jesus, the 66 books of the OT and NT were recognized as scripture.

Semites The descendants of Shem

Semites The descendants of Shem, one of Noah's sons (Gn 5:32).

sepulchre Tomb.

Sermon on the Mount The lecture Jesus gave to his disciples in Galilee, early in his ministry (Mt 5:3–7:27). It contains, among other teachings, the Beatitudes (5:3–12), the Lord's Prayer (6:9–13), and the Golden Rule (7:12).

serpent A snake, often symbolizing evil. Satan took the form of a serpent to tempt Adam and Eve.

- Gn 3:1 the **s** was more subtil than any beast of the field
- Gn 3:13 the woman said, The **s** beguiled me,
- Rv 12:9 that old **s**, called the Devil, and Satan,

Shadrach A Hebrew exiled to Babylon; his name was originally Hananiah (Dn 1:6–7). He refused defilement by food (Dn 1:8–20). He refused to worship the king's idol (Dn 3:1–18) and was saved from the furnace (Dn 3:19–30).

Sheba, queen of A queen who tested Solomon's knowledge (1 Kgs 10; 2 Chr 9). Also called the queen of the south (Mt 12:42; Lk 11:31).

Shem The oldest son of Noah; ancestor of Abraham and the Hebrew people (Gn 11:10–32; Lk 3:36).

shepherd A person who cares for sheep. It often symbolizes anyone who cares for people. The Lord is the good shepherd of all people.

Ps 23:1 The LORD is my **s**; I shall not want.

Jer 50:6 their **s** have caused them to go astray,

Ez 34:2 prophesy against the **s** of Israel,

Jn 10:11 I am the good **s**:

Shiloh From Joshua's lifetime through Samuel's lifetime, it was the town that housed the ark of the covenant and the tabernacle.

- **Simeon** 1) Son of Jacob by Leah (Gn 29:33; 35:23; 1 Chr 2:1). His descendants make up one of the twelve tribes of Israel (Gn 49:5–7). 2) Godly Jew who blessed the infant Jesus (Lk 2:25–35). 3) *See* "Simon"; "Peter" (Acts 15:14; 2 Pt 1:1).
- Simon 1) See "Peter." 2) Apostle, called Simon Zelotes, or "the Zealot" (Mt 10:4; Mk 3:18; Lk 6:15; Acts 1:13).
 3) Samaritan sorcerer (Acts 8:9–24).
- **sin** To rebel against God by disobeying and breaking his law or acting in a way that is contrary to his will. Jesus offered his life to pay the penalty for the sin of the world.
- Gn 4:7 if thou doest not do well, **s** lieth at the door.
- In 1:29 the Lamb of God which taketh away the ${f s}$ of the world.
- Rom 6:23 For the wages of \mathbf{s} is death;

Solomon Son of David by Bath-sheba (2 Sm 12:24; 1 Chr 3:5, 10). He was appointed king by David (1 Kgs 1). He asked God for wisdom (1 Kgs 3; 2 Chr 1); built the first temple in Jerusalem (1 Kgs 5–7; 2 Chr 2–5) and prayed at its dedication (1 Kgs 8; 2 Chr 6). His foreign wives turned his heart from God (1 Kgs 11:1–13). Much of Proverbs, (1 Kgs 4:32; Prv 1:1; 10:1; 25:1), several psalms (Ps 72; 127), and the Song of Solomon (Sg 1:1) are attributed to him.

son A male descendant. In biblical times, sons were greatly desired and firstborn sons received special privileges and were held in high regard (Prv 3:12).

Son of God A title of Jesus Christ, the second person of the Trinity.

- Mt 3:17 a voice from heaven saying, This is my beloved **S**,
- Mt 4:3 If thou be the **S** of God,

Son of man A phrase that means "human being" and was Jesus' favorite title for himself. After its use in Dn 7:13–14 it became a title of the Messiah, the promised Saviour of Israel.

Thaddæus Apostle; son of James (Lk 6:16; Jn 14:22; Acts 1:13). He was probably also known as Judas, son of James (Lk 6:16; Acts 1:13); the Gospel writers may have called him Thaddæus to avoid confusion with Judas Iscariot.

Thessalonica; Thessalonians A significant city where Paul and his coworkers founded a church. Paul wrote two letters to the Thessalonians that are recorded in the NT.

Acts 17:1 they came to ${\bf T},$ Phil 4:16 For even in ${\bf T}$ ye sent

Thomas Apostle (Mt 10:3; Mk 3:18; Lk 6:15; Jn 11:16; 14:5; 21:2; Acts 1:13) who at first doubted the resurrection of Jesus (Jn 20:24–28).

Timothy Christian from Lystra (Acts 16:1). He joined Paul on his second missionary journey (Acts 16–20). Paul sent him to settle problems at Corinth (1 Cor 4:17; 16:10). He led the church at Ephesus (1 Tm 1:3), and Paul wrote 1 and 2 Timothy to encourage him. He also co-authored several NT epistles with Paul. Co-writer with Paul (1 Thes 1:1; 2 Thes 1:1; Phlm 1).

tithe One tenth. In the OT, a tithe was a standard offering to God.

Nm 18:26 even a tenth part of the t.

Dt 12:17 the **t** of thy corn, or of thy wine,

transfiguration To change one's appearance. Jesus was transfigured to a bright, radiant form, displaying his heavenly glory, and was seen by three disciples (Mt 17:1–9; Mk 9:2–10; Lk 9:28–36).

transgression A sin or act of disobedience against God.

Trinity The doctrine held by Christians that there are three divine persons (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) united in the one Divine Being. NT teachings (Mt 12:32; 28:19; Lk 12:10; Acts 2:33; 1 Cor 12:4–6; 2 Cor 13:14) support this doctrine, though the word does not appear in the NT.

trust To have confidence in someone or something; to believe or have faith that someone is honest.

In most English Bibles YHWH is translated as LORD or GOD. See also "LORD"; "Tetragrammaton." **Zacchæus** A short, Jewish tax collector who climbed up a tree so he could see Jesus and became a believer (Lk 19:1–10).

Zacharias A priest, the husband of Elizabeth and father of John the Baptist (Lk 1:5–80).

Zebedee Father of the apostles James and John (Mt 4:21; Mk 1:19–20).

Zebulun Son of Jacob by Leah (Gn 30:20; 35:23; 1 Chr 2:1). His descendants make up one of the twelve tribes of Israel (Gn 49:13; Dt 33:18–19).

Zechariah; Zecharias 1) Son of Jeroboam II, king of Israel (2 Kgs 15:8–12). 2) Postexilic prophet who encouraged the rebuilding of the temple (Ezr 5:1; 6:14; Zec 1:1).

Zedekiah 1) A false prophet (1 Kgs 22:11–24; 2 Chr 18:10–23). 2) Mattaniah, son of Josiah (1 Chr 3:15), who was made king of Judah by Nebuchadnezzar (2 Kgs 24:17–25:7; 2 Chr 36:10–14; Jer 37–39; 52:1–11).

Zelotes A word meaning "zealot"; a member of the militant Jewish group that desired to overthrow the Roman government.

Lk 6:15 and Simon called **Z**,

Zephaniah A prophet during Josiah's reign, and a descendant of King Hezekiah (Zep 1:1).

Zion; Sion One of the hills on which Jerusalem is built. It often refers to the whole of Jerusalem.
